THE CHAIR'S OPENER

The final weekend of February, and Spring is just around the corner with the usual harbingers not letting us down, such as another Ashes defeat; snowdrops and the early flowering daffodils, plus umpires' refresher courses getting into full swing. However, hope springs eternal, with the England team looking to make amends for their disappointment in Australia as they take their place in the T20 World Cup semi-finals.

As we eagerly await the new season, our second as an ECB Premier League, the challenges remain considerable for both our clubs and the League Executive. Cricket is changing and evolving at a greater rate than any other major sport with much emphasis driven by ECB surrounding good governance and the rapid development of Girls' and Women's cricket. However daunting the challenges may appear, our League is well served by an ever developing and modernising Executive, plus genuine and well sourced support from the newly established Yorkshire Cricket Federation. All this hard work and progress, will in the long term provide us with a more sustainable and flourishing League.

In reviewing last season, the first thing to comment on was the wonderful weather which helped make the season so exciting with many promotion and relegation issues not settled until the final two weeks of the season, leaving our President with the massive logistical challenge of presenting many of the League winners' trophies on the last Saturday of the season - something he achieved with considerable energy and style.

Not for the first time Hoylandswaine won the Swift Teamwear Premiership, and now have the opportunity of entering the Champion of Champions trophy, known as the White Rose Trophy, a knockout competition involving the other Yorkshire ECB Premier League winners. We wish them every success as our League's flagship team!

In our Cup competitions the fantastic weather produced large crowds and memorable cricket. Scholes were victorious in the Pearson Financial Wellbeing Sykes Cup Final overcoming Honley at a packed Thongsbridge ground, where gate receipts broke all previous records, whilst Slaithwaite with victorious in the Oddfellows Cup Final.

Other notable League winners were Armitage Bridge and Hoylandswaine 2 winning the Championship and Conference respectively plus Scholes who won the T20 Trophy and Armitage Bridge the T20 Shield. A special mention also for Hoylandswaine 2nd XI who won the prestigious Crowther Cup. The progress made by several of our clubs in both the Heavy Woollen and Crowther Cups demonstrate the upward trend in the strength of our League.

In moving on I must say a special thank you to all our Umpires; Scorers and Groundsmen who all contribute massively to getting the games actually played every week. We also appreciate the generous support of all our sponsors. Walker Timber who have sponsored the League for the past two seasons have decided not to continue, which has created the opportunity for Pearson Financial Wellbeing to transfer from sponsoring the Cup competitions to becoming the League Sponsor. With the Pearson family involvement with the Scholes club and our League over many years, this provides both parties with the opportunity to develop a long term and mutually beneficial relationship. Similarly Swift Teamwear have decided not renew their sponsorship of the Premiership and have been replaced by our old friends at North Light Physiotherapy.

One other new development is our decision to move the Annual Awards & Prize Presentation back to the Cedar Court Hotel. A move which we hope will be supported by all our clubs.

So, in conclusion, change and progress continue, and I wish everyone involved in our League a most enjoyable season.

RULE CHANGES & ADDITIONS 2025 to 2026

Rule L6.2.4	Playing an unregistered/ineligible player: NEW RULE: L6.2.4: Rules L6.2.2 & L6.2.3 are not to be applied retrospectively.
Rule L8.14.2.2	Slow over rate: When fielding teams exceed the actual allowed playing time: from the start of the next over a minimum of 6 fielders must be in the fielding zone until the remainder of the innings.
Rule L8.17	Only umpires are to be responsible for any "agreed reduction of overs" games.
Rule L8.18.1.2	"Waiver Time" increased to 60 minutes for all "agreed reduction of overs" games of 30 overs or less.
Rule L8.25	NEW RULE: Except when play is in progress, practice WILL be allowed on the playing area , but not on the square on match days.
Rule C3.2	Sykes Cup: in-season registrations & Cup qualification changes in line with new competition dates of ties.
Rule OC 3.1	Oddfellows Cup: in-season registrations & Cup qualification changes in line with new competition dates of ties.
Rule TT5.10.2	"Free hit" for any type of no ball other than foot fault.
Rule TS5.10.2	"Free hit" for any type of no ball other than foot fault.

Additions & Revisions in line with ECB Premier League Regulations.

Rule L4.6.10	Confirmation of Sight Screen dimensions and deployment.
Rule L4.7	All clubs must register on the ECB Safe Hands Management System (SHMS).
Rules 7.6.9 & 7.6.10	ECB Premier League Accreditation updates, reflecting Hard Ball and Girl's cricket compliance for clubs playing in the Premiership or Championship, or wishing to do so in season 2027.
Rule L8.24.9	Rule deleted - Camera footage <u>may</u> now be viewed, and used in disciplinary matters, and footage is admissible as evidence in a hearing.

 - and the authority of the umpires.
- ***Play hard and play fair.***
- ***Accept the umpire's decision.***
- ***Create a positive atmosphere by your own conduct, and encourage others to do likewise.***
- ***Show self-discipline, even when things go against you.***
- ***Congratulate the opposition on their successes, and enjoy those of your own team.***
- ***Thank the officials and your opposition at the end of the match, whatever the result.***

Cricket is an exciting game that encourages leadership, friendship and teamwork, which brings together people from different nationalities, cultures and religions, especially when played within the Spirit of Cricket.

THE HUDDERSFIELD PREMIER CRICKET LEAGUE UMPIRES ASSOCIATION RULES

1. The Association shall be called "The Huddersfield Premier Cricket League Umpires Association".
2. The aim of the Association shall be as follows:
 - a) The furtherance of all efforts made in the best interests of the game of cricket.
 - b) Co-operation with the Huddersfield Premier Cricket League wherever this is possible in suppressing unsporting behaviour and in the furtherance of the League.
 - c) Uniformity of action by all members on the field of play.
 - d) Improvement of efficiency of all members and to create and maintain a spirit of comradeship.
 - e) All members of the Association shall be members of the ECB ACO.
 - f) All members who joined the Association after 2010 shall have a minimum Stage 2/Level 1A Umpiring Qualification & a Grade M3 or M4 to be considered to stand in 1st XI Premiership matches. The Appointments Secretary does have the authority to appoint members to Premiership matches without the appropriate grade because of no 'WhosTheUmpire' grading.
3. The annual subscription shall be fixed each year at the Annual General Meeting and will become due on the first of January each year. Any member who has not paid their membership subscription by the 31st May will not be considered for any semi-finals and finals by the Selection Committee and they could be suspended.
4. The Officers of the Association shall be President, Chairman, Secretary, Appointments Secretary, Treasurer and Training Officer, who shall, with the exception of the President, be elected at the AGM. The Officers, plus not more than six members of the Association, who shall be elected at the AGM to serve for a period of 2 years in rotation, shall form an Executive Committee (Executive). The executive shall have the power to manage the affairs of the Association and decide all matters not directly covered by the rules. Their decision shall be binding on all members. In the event of a tied vote the Chairman shall have the casting vote.
5. At the end of the current season umpires will be graded as per the 'WhosTheUmpire' system. The gradings allocated are M3 to M5 and to achieve the appropriate grade the umpire must have officiated successfully in a minimum of six matches as per the gradings chart. In June a selection committee shall meet to select umpires for the semi-finals and finals of the Huddersfield Premier Cricket League except the T20 competition. Appointments for the T20 Competition to be done by the Appointments Secretary. The Selection Committee shall consist of the Chairman, Secretary, Appointments Secretary, one member proposed by the Executive Committee and two members of the Association elected annually at the Annual General Meeting. In the event of a tied vote the Chairman shall have the casting vote.
6. The Association shall meet on the 3rd Thursday of each month from March to October. The Executive Committee of the Association will be called to meet at such times as the Secretary shall deem necessary.
7. All nominations for the Officers (with the exception of President) and the Executive Committee of the Association shall be made at the September meeting. Proposed rule alterations shall be sent, in writing to the Secretary prior to the September meeting (All proposed rules and amendments MUST be signed by the Proposer & Seconder. An electronic signature will not suffice). All alterations shall be decided at the AGM and be subject to a two-thirds majority of members who attend the meeting. The Executive shall have the power to extend an invitation to a person to be President of the association and also to invite persons to be Life Vice-Presidents. Such appointments shall be made at the September Executive meeting and announced at the AGM.
8. The Executive shall have the power to appoint any sub-committee it deems fit and proper. A League Executive Representative shall be appointed by the Executive. The Executive shall have the power to impose any penalty upon a member who brings the Association into disrepute, providing that such a member is given the right to a personal hearing before any such penalty is imposed. He also has the right of appeal. Any member shall have the right to meet the Executive provided that notification of all relevant details is given to the Secretary not later than 48 hours before such a meeting.
9. All members to umpire up to 1st XI Championship Level. Premiership matches to be appointed at the discretion of the Appointments Secretary.
10. Any Umpire wishing to change their umpiring appointments must inform the Appointments Secretary.
11. DRESS CODE. When standing in the Huddersfield Premier Cricket League matches the following shall apply:
 - (1) A clean white coat.
 - (2) White polo shirt (displaying logos if appropriate) or white shirt & league tie if available.
 - (3) Black/Navy trousers (No shorts).
 - (4) White footwear.
 - (5) Neat headwear (if worn) all of an approved standard by the ECB.

An exception to the above is that Umpires may wear coloured clothing & footwear where a competition allows for this i.e., T20 Trophy/Shield.

APPENDIX

ECB DIRECTIVES

All the following ECB directives must be enforced in all matches organised by the Huddersfield Premier Cricket League. Where appropriate, age group qualifications to be based on the age of the player as at midnight on 31st August in the year preceding the current season.

a) FAST BOWLING MATCH DIRECTIVES

For the purpose of these directives, a fast Bowler means a bowler who attempts to deliver the ball at high intensity. This includes seam bowlers, swing bowlers and medium pace bowlers.

b) CLOSE FIELDING REGULATIONS

The following are minimum fielding distances for young players in all matches where a hard ball is used:

Whilst it is the Captain's responsibility to apply these regulations, should a young player come within the restricted distances the Umpires must stop the game immediately and instruct the fielder to move back.

<i>Age in years.</i>	<i>Minimum Fielding Distance from the striking batter</i>
11 - 13	11 yards (10 metres)
14 & 15	8 yards (7.3 metres)
16 & 17	No minimum distance, but within 8 yards (7.3 metres) must wear a helmet with a faceguard or grille & a groin protector (box). It is also strongly advised that neck protectors are worn with a helmet.
18+	No minimum distance – but ECB recommends that all individuals aged 18 or over wear a helmet with a faceguard or grille.

c) SAFETY GUIDANCE ON THE WEARING OF CRICKET HELMETS BY YOUNG PLAYERS UNDER THE AGE OF 18

Helmets with a faceguard or grille should be worn when batting against a hard ball in both matches and practice sessions. *It is also strongly advised that neck protectors are worn with a helmet.*

Young players should regard a helmet with a faceguard as a normal item of protective equipment when batting, together with pads, gloves and, for boys, an abdominal protector.

Young wicketkeepers should wear a helmet with a faceguard or grille, or a wicketkeeper face protector when standing up to the stumps. *It is also strongly advised that neck protectors are worn with a helmet.*

British Safety Standard: The latest British Safety Standard is BS7928:2013 (for both adults and juniors). The full list of helmets meeting this standard is available at www.ecb.co.uk/helmets. For wicket-keeping face protectors the relevant British Safety Standard is BS7929-2:2009 (again, for both adults and juniors).

Parental consent not to wear a helmet must not be accepted in any form of cricket.

ECB Guidelines for Junior Players in Open Age Group Cricket

The ECB has issued guidance covering the selection and participation of young players in open age group cricket. This is to help clubs decide when to select young players in open age group cricket and how best to help their cricketing development when they play within open age groups. The guidance applies to boys and girls. The ECB keeps these guidelines under review and, following feedback from clubs and leagues, has revised these guidelines for the 2014 season. The ECB will continue to monitor the impact of these guidelines and you are invited to feedback your thoughts and comments in writing to the ECB Non-First Class Cricket Department.

The guidance is as follows:

General

- Making the step up from junior to open age group cricket is a significant event in any player's cricket experience. Ensure the player's safety, personal development needs and overall cricket experience are considered.
- Clubs, squad coaches and managers must take into account the requirements on age detailed in this guidance.
- Each case is to be determined on an individual basis, depending on the player's ability and stage of cognitive and emotional maturity to take part at this level – however, the minimum age guidance provided below must be adhered to.
- Juniors should be involved in all aspects of the game wherever possible i.e. socialising, team talks, practice, decision making and so on, so they feel part of the team.
- Children will often feel more comfortable and able to perform if they have a family member or friend also playing in the side.
- Remember, children's early experiences will remain with them always and will often determine whether they want to remain playing the game or give up and do something else.
- Provide an opportunity for players to show their talents in an appropriate way. Children who are just used as fielders will not fully experience the game.
- Be supportive, at all times, for all forms of effort even when children are not successful. Try and put them in situations where they will experience some success (however small) and ensure plenty of praise and encouragement
- The captain should inform the Umpires of under 18s in the side.

Cricket specific safeguarding guidance:

Restrictions:

ECB Helmets, Fast Bowling Directives and Fielding Regulations should always be adhered to for junior players in Open age group cricket.

Minimum age to play (or act as a substitute*)

Players who are selected in a **County U12 squad** in spring for a summer squad or in another squad deemed by ECB Performance Managers to be of a standard above 'district level' for that season are eligible to play Open age cricket.

This is providing they are **at least 11 years old, are in School Year 7** on 1st September in the year preceding the season, and have written parental consent to play. In allowing these players to play in open age cricket it is essential clubs and coaches recognise the 'duty of care' obligations they have towards these young players.

This means boys and girls who are county squad and area squad players, are able to play open age group cricket if they are in an U12 age group and are a minimum of 11 years old on 1st September of the year preceding the season.

District and club players who are not in a county or area squad must wait until they reach the **U13 age group, be in Year 8 and be 12 years old** on 1st September of the preceding year before being able to play in any open age group cricket. As before written parental consent is required for these players.

The duty of care should be interpreted in two ways:

- Not to place a young player in a position that involves an unreasonable risk to that young player, taking account of the circumstances of the match and the relative skills of the player.
- Not to create a situation that places members of the opposing side in a position whereby they cannot play cricket as they would normally do against adult players.

In addition, the guidelines note the need for clubs and leagues to recognise the positive experience young players should have in open age cricket. Clubs should provide an opportunity for players to show their talents in an appropriate way.

L1 TITLE, OBJECT & CONSTITUTION

L1.1 THE LEAGUE:

The League shall be called the Huddersfield Premier Cricket League (the League).

L1.2 OBJECTIVE OF THE LEAGUE:

The object of the League shall be to organise and promote the best interests of the game of cricket.

L1.3 MEMBERSHIP CRITERIA:

The League, and its member clubs, shall operate under the provision that membership is open to all, irrespective of age, gender, disability, race, ethnic origin, colour, social status and sexual orientation. (References in these Rules solely to the male gender are used purely as a space saving exercise.)

L1.4 MEMBER CLUBS:

The League shall consist of the following member clubs:

Almondbury; Almondbury Wesleyan; Armitage Bridge; Barkisland; Birkby Rose Hill; Broad Oak; Cartworth Moor; Clayton West; Cumberworth United; Delph & Dobcross; Denby; Denby Dale; Denby Grange; Edgerton & Dalton; Emley Clarence; Flockton; Golcar; Hall Bower; Holmbridge; Holmfirth; Honley; Hoylandswaine; Kirkburton; Kirkheaton; Lascelles Hall; Linthwaite; Marsden; Meltham; Mirfield, Mirfield Parish Cavaliers; Moorlands; Rastrick; Scholes; Shelley; Shepley; Skelmanthorpe; Slaithwaite; Thongsbridge; Thurstonland; Upperthong.

L1.5 PARTICIPATION:

L1.5.1 Each club shall enter 1st XI and 2nd XI teams and participate in the following competitions as appropriate: League Competitions: The Premiership; Championship Conference or Alliance. Cup Competitions: The Sykes Cup; Oddfellows Cup; T20 Trophy or T20 Shield, Paddock Shield and Earnshaw Cup.

L1.5.2 Any club may opt out of the T20 competitions provided they notify the Administration Secretary by 30th November of the preceding year.

L1.6 RESPONSIBILITY FOR TEAMS WITH JUNIOR LEAGUE MEMBERSHIP:

The League shall have overall responsibility for all teams of League clubs in membership of any junior league.

L1.7 EQUITY, DIVERSITY & INCLUSION:

The League will adopt, adhere to and apply the ECB Equity Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) Policy. Details of the policy can be viewed on the League website.

L1.8 ANTI-DISCRIMINATION CODE:

The League will adopt and enforce the provisions of the ECB Anti-Discrimination Code. Details of the code can be viewed on the League website.

L1.9 GENERAL CONDUCT REGULATIONS:

The League will adopt, adhere to and apply the ECB General Conduct Regulations (GCR) for Recreational Cricket. Details of the Regulations can be viewed on the League website.

L1.10 TIER 1 CODE OF GOOD SPORTS GOVERNANCE The League will adopt, adhere to and apply the Sport England "Tier 1 Code of Good Sports Governance" Details of the Regulations can be viewed on the League website.

L2 COUNCIL, OFFICERS, EXECUTIVE & SUB COMMITTEES

L2.1 THE COUNCIL:

- L2.1.1 The League shall be governed by a Council consisting of a representative from each club together with a President, Chair, General Secretary, Administration & Disciplinary Secretary, Finance Secretary, Registration Secretary, Match Secretary, Media Secretary and Compliance & Safeguarding Officer (the Officers).
- L2.1.2 Life Vice-Presidents appointed under the provisions of Rule L2.2 shall be ex-officio members of the Council.
- L2.1.3 From time to time any posts in the Secretariat may be combined.
- L2.1.4 Each club shall send details of their representative, and other officials, to reach the General Secretary by 31st January each year. Any club who fails to meet this deadline will be fined £10, with an additional fine of £10 for each further week/s that the details are not received by the General Secretary.
- L2.1.5 If a representative is elected as an Officer of the League, his club shall appoint another representative to serve on the Council in his place.
- L2.1.6 The Council may appoint up to a maximum of five Life Vice-Presidents, who shall be persons considered to have rendered outstanding service to the League.
- L2.1.7 The Council may also appoint as a Life Member any person it considers has made a distinguished contribution to the League and/or the game of cricket.

L2.2 THE EXECUTIVE:

- L2.2.1 A managing Executive Committee (the Executive) shall be responsible for administering the affairs of the League.
- L2.2.2 It shall consist of the Officers; two active Life Vice-Presidents and six club representatives elected annually in accordance with Rule L3.2.
- L2.2.3 The Executive may co-opt a further member plus any additional member(s) to make good any shortfall in the number of the elected club representatives.
- L2.2.4 The Executive may at any time appoint sub committees for any purpose it considers appropriate but, unless authorised, no sub-committee shall have the power to incur any financial liability on behalf of the League.

L2.3 DISCIPLINARY OR APPEALS SUB COMMITTEE:

- L2.3.1 The Administration Secretary shall be responsible for the organising of any Disciplinary or Appeals Sub Committee, each of which shall consist of a minimum of three members.
- L2.3.2 The Disciplinary Sub Committee shall include the Chair or a Life Vice-President, and the Appeals Sub Committee shall include the President or a Life Vice-President.
- L2.3.3 No member shall sit on both Sub Committees in their consideration of the same case.

L3 MEETINGS

L3.1 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING:

- L3.1.1 Unless the Executive decides otherwise the Annual General Meeting (AGM) shall be held during the first week in December.
- L3.1.2 The chair at the meeting shall be taken by the President, or in his absence, the Chair.

- L3.1.3 The business of the meeting shall include the election of Officers and the Executive for the ensuing year, the receipt and adoption, if approved, of the Annual Statement of Finance for the year ending 31st October and the declaration of the voting on any proposed new rules and/or rule amendments
- L3.1.4 Council members shall be notified in writing at least one week prior to the AGM of the meeting agenda and supplied with a copy of the unaudited Statement of Finance.

L3.1.5 Any club not represented at the AGM shall be fined £10.

L3.2 NOMINATIONS OF OFFICERS AND EXECUTIVE MEMBERS:

- L3.2.1 Nominations of Officers and Executive members may be made by any club and shall be sent to reach the Administration Secretary by 30th September.
- L3.2.2 Elections may only be made from persons so nominated and only persons with at least two years Council service may be nominated for membership of the Executive or for the Office of Chair.
- L3.2.3 Any nominations for office shall be included in the AGM notification referred to in Rule L3.1.
- L3.2.4 In the absence of alternative nominations the existing Officers and Committee members, if willing to serve, shall be declared re-elected.

L3.3 SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING:

- L3.3.1 Special General Meeting (SGM) may be convened on the initiative of the President, the Chair or the General Secretary.
- L3.3.2 The General Secretary shall convene a SGM on receipt of written requests from at least one-third of the total number of clubs.
- L3.3.3 The chair at the meeting shall be taken by the Chair, or, in his absence, a deputy elected by the club representatives present.

L3.4 COUNCIL AND EXECUTIVE MEETINGS

- L3.4.1 Council and Executive meetings shall be held from time to time, as business shall require, subject to at least one such meeting being held each month.
- L3.4.2 The chair at the meeting shall be taken by the Chair or, in his absence, a deputy elected by the club representatives present in the case of a Council meeting, or by all the members of the Committee present in the case of an Executive meeting.
- L3.4.3 Council Meetings:
- L3.4.3.1 The Umpires Association (UA) may appoint a representative to attend Council meetings on its behalf.
- L3.4.3.2 No business shall be transacted at any Council meeting unless at least one-third of the clubs are represented.
- L3.4.3.3 If an appointed representative is unable to attend a Council meeting his/her club shall appoint a substitute representative for that meeting.
- L3.4.3.4 If a club is not represented it shall be fined £5, which shall be doubled, then trebled for each subsequent absence during the calendar year.
- L3.4.4 Executive Meetings:
- L3.4.4.1 No business shall be transacted at any Executive meeting unless at least five members are present.
- L3.4.4.2 Decisions made at any meeting shall be notified to, and be binding upon, all clubs.

L3.4.4.3 The Executive shall however be accountable to the Council and, at the request of any club representative at the next scheduled Council meeting, or at an SGM, shall provide an explanation for any such decision.

L3.4.4.4 In all matters of dispute the decision of the Council shall be final.

L3.5 MEETING PROTOCOLS:

At the meetings detailed below all attendees listed shall be entitled to take part in discussions. All references to 'Chair' shall also apply to any appointed deputy. Voting rights at such meetings shall be as follows:

L3.5.1 AGM, SGM and Council meetings: club representatives shall each have one vote with the Chair having a casting vote only. Other than the Chair's casting vote, Officers, Life Vice-Presidents and the UA representative shall have no vote.

L3.5.2 Executive meetings: Officers; (other than the President and Chair), nominated Life Vice-Presidents, and elected or co-opted members of the Executive shall each have one vote. The Chair shall have a casting vote only.

L3.5.3 Sub-committee meetings: all members shall each have one vote.

L3.5.4 At all meetings votes shall be given personally and not by proxy and, unless a ballot is demanded by any member present, shall be indicated by a show of hands. Except as otherwise provided in these Rules the result of the voting shall be determined by a simple majority of the votes cast.

L4 MEMBERSHIP, SUBSCRIPTIONS AND INSURANCE

L4.1 ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTION:

L4.1.1 Each club shall pay an annual subscription of **£99**.

L4.1.2 Annual subscriptions are to be received by the Finance Secretary by no later than 31st May. Any club failing to meet this requirement shall be fined 10% of the balance owing for every week or part week during which it remains unpaid.

L4.1.3 The subscription shall be amended each odd numbered year by applying the percentage change in the RPI for the preceding two-year period, November to October, and calculated to the nearest £1.

L4.1.4 The Executive shall call upon clubs to contribute such further sums to League funds as may be considered necessary, including all Yearbook costs.

L4.2 PUBLIC LIABILITY:

L4.2.1 All clubs shall take out public liability insurance, with a minimum indemnity cover of £5m.

L4.2.2 Each season a copy of the relevant cover-note or appropriate policy documentation, shall be sent to the Administration Secretary to be received by no later than the second Saturday in April.

L4.2.3 For clubs with a Policy renewal date within the season the relevant documentation should be received at least one week before the expiry date of the current policy.

L4.2.4 Failure to comply with this Rule shall result in a fine of £5 for each day beyond which the appropriate information has not been received by the Administration Secretary, culminating in the suspension of the club concerned if the copy is not received. No liability shall be incurred by the League, the Executive or any Officer of the league due to the failure of any club to meet the requirements of this Rule.

L4.3 APPLICATION TO JOIN THE LEAGUE:

An application for membership of the League by a club must reach the General Secretary by 31st January in respect of the following year. It shall be considered and decided by the Executive subject to the requirements of Rule L3.4.4.

L4.4 JOINING FEE:

Any club admitted shall pay an entrance fee equal to twice the amount of the annual subscription which shall include the first year's subscription.

L4.5 RESIGNING FROM THE LEAGUE:

Any club wishing to resign from the League must give notice in writing to the General Secretary by 30th June in the year previous to the season in which they intend to cease membership of this League.

L4.6 MINIMUM STANDARDS:

L4.6.1 Clubs are expected to achieve the minimum standards (listed below) for grounds and facilities as required by the following legislation.

L4.6.2 To ensure these standards are maintained, regular inspections will be carried out by members of the League Executive, and where clubs are in breach of the expected standards, they will be advised in writing of any remedial action required. Any club who fails to take the required action over an agreed time scale could be subject to an appropriate fine, or in severe cases a deduction of league points.

The set of Minimum Standards are reproduced below:

L4.6.3 First Aid:

L4.6.3.1 Clubs should have a well-stocked and accessible first aid kit available for all games.

L4.6.3.2 It is recommended that there is a qualified first aider in attendance at all games.

L4.6.4 Seating:

L4.6.4.1 Any seating which is provided for games should be safe and well maintained

L4.6.5 Changing Rooms:

L4.6.5.1 Both home and away changing rooms should be clean and tidy, ideally with sufficient space for each team.

L4.6.5.2 Both changing room doors should be lockable, with keys provided.

L4.6.6 Showers:

L4.6.6.1 Clubs should have a clean and tidy functioning shower area for both teams.

L4.6.6.2 Access to the shower area should not be via a public area, and privacy of the area should be ensured.

L4.6.7 Umpires' Room:

L4.6.7.1 Clubs should supply a separate changing area, exclusively for the use of the umpires.

L4.6.7.2 The room should be clean and tidy with sufficient changing space for two umpires.

L4.6.7.3 The doors of the umpires' room should be lockable, with keys provided.

L4.6.8 Playing Area:

L4.6.8.1 Clubs shall provide a well-maintained playing area and outfield.

L4.6.8.2 Pitches:

L4.6.8.2.1 All pitches shall be marked out as per MCC Law 7.

L4.6.8.2.2 In all ECB Premiership and Championship games club must make every attempt to play on central pitches only.

L4.6.8.2.3 In all ECB Premiership and Championship games, umpires shall mark pitches in line with **Who's The Umpire** criteria.

L4.6.8.2.3.1 Clubs must submit a creditable Action Plan to the League Executive designed to improve the quality of their pitches if they score:
L4.6.8.2.3.1.1 12 or less out of 20 during the season on two separate occasions.
L4.6.8.2.3.1.2 An average of less than 14 at the end of the season.

L4.6.8.2.3.2 In the event of a match score below 3 out of 5 being recorded in any category, the League Executive will investigate the circumstances and act accordingly.

L4.6.8.3 Boundaries:

L4.6.8.3.1 There shall be well defined and accurate boundary edge markings.

L4.6.8.3.2 In all ECB Premier League matches, clubs should ensure minimum boundary dimensions of 45 yards square of the wicket, and 37.5 yards straight from the striking batter's wicket.

L4.6.8.3.3 All ECB Premiership and Championship games should be played on boundaries within an acceptable margin of approximation of the dimensions in Rule L4.6.8.3.2.

L4.6.8.4 Any non-turf pitch must be well maintained.

L4.6.9 Scorebox/Scoreboard

L4.6.9.1 All clubs should provide a clean, tidy and private space for both scorers which they should use together at all times.

L4.6.9.2 Scoring areas shall be safe, self-contained, covered and easily accessible.

L4.6.9.3 All scoreboards shall have a clear display, and provide a minimum of: "current innings total" "wickets" "overs" and "1st innings score".

L4.6.9.4 As a minimum the "current innings total" should be changed at the end of each over, and the others as appropriate.

L4.6.9.5 All detail on the scoreboard shall be individually defined with the appropriate labelling.

L4.6.9.6 All ECB Premiership clubs should have a continually changing ball by ball manual or electronic scoreboard display.

L4.6.10 Sight Screens:

Unless prior dispensation has been given by the Executive Committee:

L4.6.10.1 All clubs shall have at least two well-maintained, sight screens, one at each end of the ground, in use at all games.

L4.6.10.2 All single sight screens shall be at least 4 metres wide and 4 metres high, although this could be higher if ground contours dictate.

L4.6.10.3 All ECB Premiership and Championship teams must extend Rule L.4.6.10.1 to include sight screen coverage at each end of the ground that is a minimum of 8m wide.

L4.6.11 Covers:

L4.6.11.1 Clubs should provide adequate fit for purpose covers, in order to protect the immediate playing area and bowler's run ups.

L4.6.12 Machinery:

L4.6.12.1 Clubs should ensure that both a heavy and light roller are available for use during match days.

L4.6.12.2 All clubs shall ensure that they have adequate machinery to maintain the playing area, together with acceptable arrangements for the preparation and maintenance of the outfield.

L4.6.13 Surrounds:

L4.6.13.1 Any painted walls, grassed or other areas should be presentable and regularly maintained.

L4.6.14 Scoring:

L4.6.14.1 Electronic scoring with on line Wi-Fi or data connectivity to Play Cricket Scorer or Play Cricket Scorer Pro to be used by clubs at all games.

L4.7 SAFE HANDS MANAGEMENT SYSTEM:

All clubs must register on the ECB Safe Hands Management System (SHMS). This system allows club safeguarding officers or the designated club administrator to manage all regulated club roles.

L5 PLAYER REGISTRATION - PROCEDURES

L5.1 REGISTRATION PROCESS:

L5.1.1 The registration process requires both the completion of an up-to-date Registration, Transfer and Declaration Form (RTDF) and the completion of a League Registered Player (LRP) nomination on the club's Play-Cricket website, including assigning a Category to the player as per Rule L5.4. This process is only complete when the LRP nomination has been authorised by the Registration Secretary. The player will then be deemed to be a registered player of the club, and be subject to the provisions of Rule L6.

L5.1.2 Any club wishing to register a player whether by transfer or otherwise, shall ensure that the RTDF is duly completed in accordance with the provisions of this Rule or the special provisions of Rule L9.2. The responsibility for an accurate, and on time, registration lies jointly with the player and the applying club.

L5.1.3 If a player is registered incorrectly, and subsequently plays in a match/es he shall be deemed to be ineligible and the provisions of Rule L6.2 shall apply.

L5.2 ANNUAL AUDIT OF REGISTRATIONS:

L5.2.1 Each club Secretary shall review their current list of League Registered Players, including the Player category in accordance with their current circumstances, on the Club's Play-Cricket website, and in writing each year notify the Registration Secretary of any changes, by not later than 31st March.

L5.3 PLAYER REGISTRATION:

- L5.3.1 Subject to Rule L6 a player who becomes a member of a club, and who is not currently registered with another club, may be registered by following the process outlined in Rule L5.1. If this process is completed by no later than midnight on a Friday, then the player shall be eligible to play for his club from the following Saturday.
- L5.3.2 Subject to Rule L6 a player who wishes to transfer from another club to a League club, may be registered by following the process outlined in Rule L5.1., but taking note of the transfer procedures included in the RTDF and/or LRP nomination on the club's Play-Cricket website. The player's eligibility to play for his club shall be as defined in Rule L5.3.1.
- L5.3.3 The Registration Secretary shall publish notice of the registration on the League website.
- L5.3.4 Overseas players, players requiring a transfer and players who have played competitive open-age cricket anywhere in the world during the current or previous two seasons may not be registered between 1st August and the end of the season.
- L5.3.5 In all cases of registration the burden of proof lies totally with the applying club and the player.
- L5.3.6 The Executive reserve the right to refuse, or cancel, any registration should a player fail to produce for examination, within seven days of being given notice, the necessary documentation when demanded by the Registration Secretary. This examination, by any nominated Executive member, shall include any papers from the Home Office (Immigration & Nationality Directorate), a Birth Certificate, a Passport, a National Insurance Card and/or any other qualification detail.

L5.4 PLAYER CATEGORIES:

- L5.4.1 Category 1: a Player may be registered as a "Category 1 Player" if
- L5.4.1.1 they are: EITHER (i) a British or Irish citizen; or (ii) an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen, with settled or pre-settled status under the EU Settlement Scheme, **OR**
- L5.4.1.2 has been resident in England and Wales for a minimum of 210 days between 1 April and 31 March in the year preceding their participation in the relevant League, **PLUS** in either L5.4.1.1 or L5.4.1.2
- L5.4.1.3 has not played cricket as a local/domestic player in any ICC Full Member Country (except England) in the 12-month period up to and including 31 March before the season in question, or at any time subsequently before or after applying to be, and being registered as a Category 1 Player.
- L5.4.2 Category 2: A Category 2 Contracted Player is defined as a player (capped or uncapped) qualified to play for England under the current ECB regulations and, currently, under contract to a First-Class County Club or MCC Young Cricketers. For the purposes of clarification, a contracted player is one who has a current full playing contract, a summer contract or a development (scholarship) contract, but not an Academy contract (16-19 years).
- L5.4.3 Category 3: A player who does not meet the criteria for either Category 1 or 2.

L6 PLAYER REGISTRATION - GENERAL

L6.1 PLAYER & CLUB RESPONSIBILITIES:

- L6.1.1 Players who have been duly registered in accordance with Rule L5 or Rule L9.2 (on day 2nd XI registration) shall be subject to all the provisions of this Rule.
- L6.1.2 A club shall only register players who have fully complied with its membership requirements.

L6.2 PLAYING AN UNREGISTERED/INELIGIBLE PLAYER:

- L6.2.1 A player shall only play in League matches for the club with which he is registered and, other than via Rule L6.4, no person who is not a League Registered Player regardless of age shall be eligible to play for any club in any League match.
- L6.2.2 A team playing an ineligible player shall, be fined £40 and have six points deducted from its league record for each contravention.
- L6.2.3 A team shall also forfeit any points gained from the match and the opposing team shall be awarded the six points under the provisions of Rule L7.4.
- L6.2.4 Any sanctions arising from Rules L6.2.2 and 6.2.3. shall only be applied from the date at which they have become known. Should a case come to their attention, the Executive may choose to temporarily suspended a player pending the outcome of any potential investigations."*
- L6.2.5 Where no play is possible the opposing team shall only receive the two points available for an abandoned match.

L6.3 JUNIOR PLAYER REGISTRATION RESTRICTION:

- L6.3.1 No player under the age of 12 on the 1st September in the year preceding the season may register to play in adult cricket, unless they satisfy the "ECB Guidelines for Junior players in Open Age Group Cricket" - Page 36.
- L6.3.2 Players 12 years old on 1st September in the year preceding the season, plus those who qualify via Rule L6.3.1, may play in adult cricket provided that parental consent is given via Part1a of the RTDF during the Registration Process

L6.4 LOAN OF PLAYERS UNDER THE AGE OF 17:

- L6.4.1 A registered player aged 17 or under may play in a Second Eleven for another club without a formal transfer, provided the latter club obtains:
- L6.4.1.1 The prior permission of the club with which the player is registered.
- L6.4.1.2 Gives written notification of the arrangement to the Registration Secretary immediately it has been made.

L6.5 REGISTRATION EXCEPTIONS:

- L6.5.1 Except as provided by Rule L5.3.2, no player shall be registered by more than one club during the same season.
- L6.5.2 No Category 2 or Category 3 cricketer, shall be eligible to play in the last six League matches of a season unless he has previously played in a minimum of four League matches for his club during that season.
- L6.5.3 With the exemption of "Home Grown" players, only one Category 2 Contracted Player shall be registered at a club at any one time.
- L6.5.3.1 Any club wishing to apply for "Home Grown" status for a player must provide written evidence of such to the General Secretary. Their claim will be considered within seven days of receipt, and the decision made shall be final.

L6.6 CATEGORY 3 PLAYERS:

- L6.6.1 Only one person who is designated a Category 3 player shall be registered at a club at any one time.
- L6.6.2 The registration shall be made each season, and not until after his arrival in the UK.
- L6.6.3 After this time a Category 3 player may only be changed with the agreement of the Executive.

L6.7 PLAYING IN ANOTHER LEAGUE or COMPETITION:

If a registered player plays in another league or competition on a date when his club is playing in a League fixture, his registration shall be cancelled for the remainder of that season, unless:

- L6.7.1 He is required to do so by a County Club to which he is contracted, or
- L6.7.2 The match in which he plays is a recognised international fixture, or
- L6.7.3 The Executive, at its discretion, decides otherwise.

L6.8 SUSPENDED PLAYERS:

No player subject to suspension or other disciplinary action under the jurisdiction of any other league or competition may be registered.

L6.9 ACCEPTANCE OF LEAGUE RULES:

It shall be a condition of registration that the player accepts the authority of the League's Rules, including the result of any relevant disciplinary action taken there under. In the case of a contracted player, whether UK or Overseas, the agreement between the player and the club shall include a written acknowledgement by the player of his obligations under this Rule.

L6.10 REPRESENTATIVE TEAMS:

League selection committees shall have priority in the choice of players chosen for any League representative teams. This priority will also extend to those selected to play in the Joe Lumb Cricket Competition.

L6.11 RESPONSIBILITY OF CLUBS:

All club officials and players should carefully read and understand this rule and Rule L5, in conjunction with YCB Rules regarding Transfer of Players, when dealing with any transfer of a player from one club to another, irrespective of whether it is within this League or between leagues.

L7 FIXTURES, POINTS & AVERAGES

L7.1 PROMOTION AND RELEGATION:

There shall be independent promotion and relegation between all divisions as outlined in Rule L7.6.

L7.2 SEASON COMMENCEMENT:

The season shall begin on the third Saturday in April.

L7.3 START DATE & TIME:

All matches shall be played on dates arranged by the Match Secretary and the scheduled starts shall be:

Premiership; Championship and Conference matches: April - August: 12.30pm.
September: 12 Noon.

All Alliance matches: 1.00pm. September: 12.30pm.

No match shall be re-arranged without the approval of the Executive.

L7.4 LEAGUE POINTS:

League points shall be awarded as follows:

- L7.4.1 **SIX POINTS:** for a win - team scoring most runs (note Duckworth Lewis Stern) or if the opposing team fails to meet the requirements of Rule L7.5.
- L7.4.2 **NO POINTS:** for a loss - team scoring least runs, plus any performance points.
- L7.4.3 **FOUR POINTS:** for a tie - both teams scoring the same number of runs (note Duckworth Lewis Stern).
- L7.4.4 **TWO POINTS:** Incomplete, or abandoned, match due to adverse weather, where no result has been achieved (note Duckworth Lewis Stern).
- L7.4.5 **Performance Points:** To be awarded in the second innings only and only to the losing team:
- L7.4.5.1 **Batting:**
- L7.4.5.1.1 Scoring 75% of the 1st innings total, or the final revised 1st innings total - 1 performance point awarded.
- L7.4.5.1.2 Scoring 90% of the 1st innings total, or of the final revised 1st innings total - 1 further performance point awarded.
- L7.4.5.1.3 All % calculations shall be rounded up to the next whole figure
- L7.4.5.1.4 Batting performance points are retained if the batting team is all out.
- L7.4.5.2 **Bowling:**
- L7.4.5.2.1 Taking 6 wickets - 1 performance point awarded.
- L7.4.5.2.2 Taking 8 wickets - 1 further performance point awarded.

L7.5 UNFULFILLED FIXTURES:

- L7.5.1 Any club unable to fulfil a fixture must at the earliest opportunity contact, and receive acknowledgement from:
- L7.5.1.1 The Match & Registration Secretary
- L7.5.1.2 The Fixtures Secretary of the Umpires' Association and,
- L7.5.1.3 The Secretary of the opposing club.
- L7.5.2 A club which concedes a League match will receive no points, be fined £50, and provided at least one game throughout the League on the day has been completed, the 6 points for a win will be awarded to the opposing team. Should no games be completed on that day the opposing team will be awarded 2 points for an abandoned match.
- L7.5.3 In the event that the transgressors are the away side they will be required to pay a further £100 in compensation to their opponents.
- L7.5.4 In addition, a team conceding a league game shall be penalised a further 2 points for the first concession, 4 points for second concession and 6 points for each further concession.
- L7.5.5 In any event the transgressors will also be required to pay both umpires full all-inclusive expenses should the said umpires, have attended the match or not been allocated an alternative fixture.

L7.6 PROMOTION AND RELEGATION:

- Club eligibility for participation in the Premiership and Championship is set in accordance with ECB's Premier League Accreditation Criteria.
- Promotion and relegation from all divisions is outlined below:
- L7.6.1 In each division the team which has the highest number of points at the end of the season shall be declared Champions. Promotion and relegation shall be determined as follows, but with the provisos listed in Rules L7.6.2 - Rule L7.6.7

- L7.6.1.1 The bottom two teams in the Premiership being replaced by the winners and runners-up of the Championship.
- L7.6.1.2 The bottom two teams in the Championship being replaced by the two highest finishing 1st XI teams in the Conference.
- L7.6.1.3 The bottom two teams in the Conference being replaced by the winners and runners up of the Alliance.
- L7.6.1.4 The bottom two teams in the Alliance being replaced by the winners and runners-up of Alliance 2.
- L7.6.1.5 The bottom two teams in Alliance 2 being replaced by the winners and runners-up of Alliance 3.
- L7.6.1.6 The bottom two teams in Alliance 3 being replaced by the winners and runners-up of Alliance 4.
- L7.6.2 No 2nd XI can be promoted into the Premiership or Championship. Promotion places into the Championship will be taken by the two highest finishing 1st XI teams in the Conference.
- L7.6.3 No 2nd XI team can be promoted into a section containing its 1st XI team. In these circumstances the promotion place will be taken by the highest finishing qualifying team.
- L7.6.4 If a 1st XI team is relegated into a division containing its 2nd XI team, then the 2nd XI team will also be relegated, and the highest qualifying team will not be relegated.
- L7.6.5 No 1st XI team in the Alliance finishing in a relegation position, having been relegated the previous season from the Conference into the Alliance, shall be relegated into Alliance 2, unless requested to do so by the club. The relegation place or places will be taken by the lowest qualifying team/s in the Alliance.
- L7.6.6 No 1st XI team can be relegated from Alliance 3 into Alliance 4. In these circumstances the relegation place will be taken by the lowest finishing qualifying team in Alliance 3.
- L7.6.7 No club can play in the Premiership or Championship without ECB Clubmark accreditation.
- L7.6.8 Any club in the Premiership or Championship that has Clubmark accreditation denied or removed by the ECB will be relegated.
 - L7.6.8.1 In the case of a Premiership club this will mean relegation to the Championship, and if they do not achieve Clubmark accreditation in the following year they will face a further relegation.
 - L7.6.8.2 In the case of a Championship club this will mean relegation to the Conference, and they will not be eligible for promotion back to the Championship until they secure Clubmark accreditation.
- L7.6.9 *Clubs with a 1st XI in the Premiership or Championship are required to have:*
 - L7.6.9.1 *a cricket programme available for 5-11 years, which can include All Stars or Dynamos or a club's own 5-11 years programme.*
 - L7.6.9.2 *at least three hardball junior teams, which can include a girls' hardball team. These teams can be at any Age Group from **and including U11 up to U18 level**, and must enter a formal league competition recognised by the YCF.*

L7.6.9.3 a Girls' Section. This section can be at any Age Group from **and** including U9 up to U18 level.*

** A Girls' Section is defined as a minimum of one girls' team playing in either a softball or hardball fixture, league or friendly, indoors, or outdoors, and scored on Play-Cricket.*

L7.6.10 Failure to comply with Rule L7.6.9

*L7.6.10.1 Where a club is not in a position to comply with Rules L7.6.9.1 and/or L7.6.9.2 by **31 October 2026**, a grace period of 12 months may be granted - provided the club submits a suitable action plan to both the League and YCF.*

L7.6.10.2 If the club remains non-compliant after the grace period, the club will be deemed ineligible to play in the Premiership or Championship, and shall be relegated to the Conference.

L7.6.10.3 Where a club is not in a position to comply with Rule L7.6.9.3 by:

*L7.6.10.3.1 - **31 March 2026**, and cannot evidence sustained attempts to reach this deadline in collaboration with the YCF, the League will issue a 6 points deduction ahead of the 2026 season.*

*L7.6.10.3.2 - **31 October 2026**, they will be deemed ineligible to play in the Premiership or Championship, and shall be relegated to the Conference.*

*L7.6.10.4 Only Clubs who are fully compliant with ECB Premier League criteria by **31 October 2026**, may be promoted from the Conference into the Championship for the 2027 season.*

L7.6.10.5 The ECB will review and determine outcomes for clubs citing unforeseen circumstances.

L7.6.11 The Executive are empowered to decide on any issues surrounding promotion and relegation, which are not wholly covered by the rules above.

L7.7 TIE BREAKERS:

L7.7.1 In the event of two or more teams having the same number of points, positions in the League table shall be determined by reference to the results obtained during the season in the following order of priority:

L7.7.1.1 The greatest number of wins achieved.

L7.7.1.2 The highest points per game average achieved, exclusive to all head to head games amongst the two or more teams.

L7.7.1.3 The better or best average of runs achieved, for and against per wicket.

L7.7.2 In the event of clubs having the same number of points over the last 6 games of the season, the outright winners of the Hopkinson Trophy and Schweppes Cup will be determined by applying Rules L7.7.1.1 and L7.7.1.3.

L7.8 SUBMISSION OF AVERAGES:

Each club shall send the following information for all their current players, within two weeks of the last League match of the season, to the Match Secretary for both 1st XI and 2nd XIs, having regard to the qualifications shown below.

Performances in matches not completed because of inclement weather shall be included. Nil returns shall be made where there is no qualifier, making a total of sixteen returns for the two Elevens.

L7.8.1 League matches only:

L7.8.1.1 Best batter's average:

Premiership; Championship and Conference - 400 runs.

Alliance - 300 runs.

For qualification purposes, the player must have batted in at least 50% of the scheduled matches for the relevant division.

L7.8.1.2 Best bowler's average:

Premiership; Championship and Conference - 35 wickets.

Alliance: - 25 wickets.

L7.8.1.3 Best wicketkeeper's record (leading wicketkeeper in each team).

L7.8.1.4 Best fielder's record (the leading fielder in each team, excluding any catches as wicketkeeper).

L7.8.2 All League and Sykes Cup, Oddfellows Cup, Paddock Shield and Earnshaw Cup matches combined:

L7.8.2.1 List of all batter's averages:

Premiership; Championship and Conference - 450 runs.

Alliance - 325 runs.

For qualification purposes, the player must have batted in at least 50% of the scheduled matches plus one, for the relevant section, e.g. 26 matches - 14 innings; 23 matches - 13 innings.

L7.8.2.2 List of all bowlers' averages:

Premiership; Championship and Conference - 40 wickets.

Alliance - 30 wickets.

L7.8.2.3 List of all wicketkeepers' records.

L7.8.2.4 List of three leading fielders' records (excluding matches as wicketkeeper).

L7.8.3 Any club failing to comply with this rule shall be fined £50.

L8 MATCH PROCEDURES & RESULTS

L8.1 MATCH CONDUCT:

All matches shall be conducted in accordance with the Laws of Cricket, including the Spirit of Cricket and all ECB Directives, Guidelines & Regulations, with the exception of MCC Law 42.1.4 where the batsman at the wicket may deputise for their captain, except as otherwise provided by this Rule.

L8.2 ADMISSION FEE:

L8.2.1 The home club shall have a choice of taking a collection or charging the following admission fees for Premiership; Championship and Conference fixtures: Adults: £1.50 and Concessions £1.00.

L8.2.2 For all Alliance matches the home club shall have the option to charge admission fees, but any such fees shall not exceed half of the above amounts.

L8.3 PREPARATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE PLAYING AREA:

L8.3.1 No pitch shall be artificially watered, or in any way tampered with, during the period commencing 36 hours before the scheduled start of a match. A club who contravenes this Rule shall be fined £20 and have six points deducted from its total.

L8.3.2 After the toss, the pitch may then be rolled for not more than 7 minutes.

L8.3.3 The captain of the side batting second may require the pitch to be swept and rolled, with a choice of roller, for not more than 7 minutes between the innings. All rolling, whether mandatory or optional, and sweeping shall be the responsibility of the home club, and shall be supervised by the umpires.

L8.4 COVERING THE PITCH:

L8.4.1 Clubs should use covers at the earliest opportunity, to protect the pitch and surrounding areas when inclement weather threatens a prompt or delayed start of play, and also at any interruptions in play due to inclement weather.

L8.4.2 Umpires are asked to report on the Team and Match Report Form (TMRF), where no reasonable efforts have been made to comply with the above, in order for the Executive to take any appropriate action.

L8.5 FITNESS OF THE PITCH FOR PLAY:

L8.5.1 The umpires shall be the only judges of the fitness of the ground, weather and light, both before and during the match.

L8.5.2 In order for play to start, continue or resume, both umpires should agree, at all times, that conditions do not present an actual and foreseeable risk of injury to any player or umpire.

L8.5.3 No match shall be cancelled or abandoned by the umpires on account of adverse weather or ground conditions until at least one hour after the scheduled start.

L8.5.4 The visiting captain may object to the condition of the pitch, other than damage caused by adverse weather, before the scheduled start of a match.

L8.5.5 If the objection is allowed by the umpires, whose decision shall be final, they shall order the home club to prepare another pitch under their supervision

L8.5.6 If after play has started on time, the umpires consider a pitch to be unsuitable and/or dangerous, and less than 30 overs have been bowled, they shall proceed as above and start a new match applying the conditions of Rule L8.10. Should 30 overs or more have been completed the match shall be abandoned.

L8.5.7 If the umpires disagree on the condition of the pitch, the match shall NOT be played, or continued, on the original pitch. In all cases the umpires shall forward a joint report to the Match Secretary.

L8.5.8 A club whose ground has not been fully prepared for play to start as scheduled, or either of whose teams is not ready to start play as scheduled with the minimum seven players, irrespective of adverse weather, shall be reported on the TMRF, and shall be fined £5 plus £1 for each minute by which the start of the match is delayed.

L8.6 NOMINATION OF PLAYERS:

L8.6.1 Before the toss is made, the team captains shall:

L8.6.1.1 List their players taking part in the match on the TMRF, and pass a copy to the senior umpire together along with the match balls for each innings.

L8.6.1.2 State on the TMRF the ages of any player under 19 years of age on the 31st August in the previous year.

L8.6.2 Only players named on the TMRF shall be allowed to bat, bowl or keep wicket in the match, although with the permission of the umpires a substitute fielder may be allowed to keep wicket.

L8.6.3 In an emergency a captain may list one entry as a "2nd XI player" in anticipation of a late arrival, provided that the player falls into the category.

L8.6.4 A minimum of seven players is required to start a match and at least five must be 16 years or over.

L8.7 THE TOSS:

L8.7.1 The toss for the choice of innings shall take place on the field of play and between the two captains, with at least one umpire present.

L8.7.2 The captains shall toss for choice of innings not earlier than 30 minutes, nor later than 15 minutes, before the start of play.

L8.7.3 The captain winning the toss shall announce his intentions to bat or bowl to the opposing captain and umpires immediately after the toss.

L8.7.4 At the toss the umpires must confirm who has been appointed as the Duckworth Lewis Stern Match Manager (DLSMM).

L8.8 THE MATCH BALL:

L8.8.1 Premiership and Championship: Each team shall use its own new Dukes County International 'A' cricket ball.

L8.8.2 Conference: Each team shall use its own new Reader Sovereign Grade 'A' cricket ball.

L8.8.3 In all Alliance matches each team shall use its own ball. It shall be a new Readers Sovereign Grade 'A' cricket ball, or a ball which need not be new, but of acceptable quality, approved by the Executive and purchased from the League.

L8.8.4 All balls should be approved by the Executive, and purchased from the League.

L8.8.5 Match balls shall be handed to the umpires for their approval before they take the field of play.

L8.8.6 Subject to any special arrangements made by the home club, the batting side shall be responsible for organising a search for any ball lost during play.

L8.9 THE SCORER:

L8.9.1 Teams shall ensure that at all matches, and at all times a responsible person is available to carry out the duty of scorer.

L8.9.2 No match shall commence, or continue, unless one person representing each team occupies the area designated for scoring duties.

L8.10 LENGTH OF INNINGS:

L8.10.1 In all Premiership, Championship and Conference matches each team shall bowl a maximum of 50 overs.

L8.10.2 In all Alliance matches each team shall bowl a maximum of 45 overs.

L8.10.3 In the event of play not starting as scheduled, due to adverse weather or ground conditions, the umpires shall reduce each team's overs by one for every full period of six minutes of playing time lost, allowing for a minimum of a 20 overs per side game.

L8.10.4 The decision to start matches shall be made as follows:

L8.10.4.1 Premiership, Championship and Conference: no later than 3 hours after the scheduled start time.

L8.10.4.2 Alliance: no later than 2½ hours after the scheduled start time.

L8.10.4.3 In all the above matches the start shall be made within a further half hour, and in these circumstances the tea interval will already have been taken.

L8.10.5 Latest starts times:

L8.10.5.1 Premiership, Championship & Conference: 4.00pm. September: 3.30pm

L8.10.5.2 All Alliance Divisions: 4.00pm. September: 3.30pm.

L8.10.6 During each innings the home club shall ensure that the number of overs to bowl is clearly indicated on the scoreboard.

L8.10.7 Once the first ball of the game has been bowled there shall be no reduction in overs other than as described under Rule L8.18 - Interrupted Games. Any such reduction shall be an even number of full overs which shall be applied equally to both innings until the conclusion of the 1st innings. The scheduled length of the 2nd innings must be full overs and can never be longer than the final scheduled length of the 1st innings.

L8.11 NUMBER OF OVERS PER BOWLER:

L8.11.1 In Premiership, Championship and Conference matches, no bowler may bowl more than 15 overs in an innings. If the overs are reduced due to a delayed start, an agreed reduction of overs or by interruptions to games, the maximum overs permitted per bowler will be as follows:

L8.11.2 In Alliance matches, no bowler may bowl more than 12 overs in an innings. If the overs are reduced due to a delayed start, an agreed reduction of overs or by interruptions to games, the maximum overs allowed per bowler will be as follows:

Length of Innings	Maximum overs per bowler	Length of Innings	Maximum overs per bowler
45-42 overs	12 overs	30-27 overs	8 overs

L8.11.3 In Alliance 2,3 and 4 matches, each bowler shall be allowed to bowl a maximum of 9 overs.

If the overs are reduced due to a delayed start, an agreed reduction of overs or by interruptions to games, then the maximum overs per bowler shall be reduced by one over for every five overs deducted. Where the total overs are not divisible by 5, one additional over shall be allowed to the maximum number per bowler necessary to make up the balance.

L8.11.4 Any incomplete over, which needs to be completed at the time of a stoppage due to inclement weather, must be completed by the same bowler at the restart of play, even though this could take him beyond the newly calculated maximum overs per bowler.

L8.12 "LEG SIDE WIDE":

In Premiership, Championship, Conference and Alliance matches, deliveries

passing wide of the leg stump, and outside the line of the batsman's body, that do not come into contact with the bat or any part of the batsman's person, shall be called WIDE.

L8.13 RESTRICTIONS ON THE PLACEMENT OF FIELDERS:

- L8.13.1 In all matches a fielding zone shall be drawn on the field of play. This shall consist of two semi-circles having respective centres at each middle stump, and joined by a parallel line on each side of the pitch. The radius of each of the circles shall be 30 yards, but where any part of this zone would impinge within five yards of the boundary line then it shall be drawn at that limitation. The perimeter of the fielding zone shall be marked by a series of white discs.
- L8.13.2 A minimum of 4 fielders, plus the bowler and the wicketkeeper must be inside the fielding zone, at the instant of delivery, throughout the innings. In the event of any infringement the umpire at square leg shall call and signal "no ball".
- L8.13.3 In Premiership, Championship, Conference and Alliance matches, at the instant of delivery, there shall be no more than 5 fielders on the leg side. In the event of any infringement the umpire at square leg shall call and signal "no ball".

L8.14 SLOW OVER RATE:

- L8.14.1 All instances of slow over rates shall be reported by the umpires on the TMRP.
- L8.14.2 If the fielding team exceed the actual playing time (drinks breaks, injuries and unavoidable stoppages are not to be included as playing time) then:
- L8.14.2.1 they shall be fined £5 plus £3 for each completed, or partially completed over started thereafter, and also
- L8.14.2.2 from the start of the next new over, a minimum of *six* fielders (plus the bowler and the wicketkeeper) must be inside the fielding zone for the remainder of the innings.
- L8.14.3 For the purpose of this Rule actual playing time shall start when the first ball of the innings is bowled. If an innings is interrupted by adverse weather that timing shall be suspended when the umpires have removed the bails and shall re-start with the first ball after the interruption.
- L8.14.4 In matches where the start is delayed through adverse weather, or because of any in game interruptions of more than 30 minutes accumulated time, the time allowed shall be reduced by 3.5 minutes for each over deducted. For any odd over game the time allowed after any reduction will be rounded up. See below:

L8.14.5 If a team infringes Rule 8.14.2.1 more than once, during a season, second and subsequent fines shall be progressively doubled, trebled etc.

L8.15 EARLY ABANDONMENT:

L8.15.1 If it appears obvious that due to inclement weather, a ground will not be fit for play, the home captain/representative may phone the away captain/representative prior to 10.00am on the day of the match to suggest the game is abandoned.

L8.15.2 If agreed the game shall be abandoned, and all relevant parties informed.

L8.15.2.1 For Premiership, Championship and Conference matches the Home Club must inform, and receive acknowledgement from both appointed umpires; the Match & Registration Secretary, and also inform the Appointments Secretary of the Umpires' Association.

L8.15.3 If not agreed the captains/representatives shall meet on the morning of the game to inspect the ground and reach a decision on the fitness of the ground. If the two captains/representatives do not agree then both teams must turn up as normal.

L8.16 DELAYED STARTS:

See Rules L8.10.4 and L8.10.5

L8.17 AGREED REDUCTION OF OVERS:

If both umpires agree that the prevailing weather conditions make it unlikely that the required maximum number of overs allocated to a game would be completed, they may prior to the start of play, agree to reduce the number of overs down to a minimum of 20 overs. Umpires' Expenses will remain unchanged in a reduced over game.

L8.18 INTERRUPTED GAMES:

L8.18.1 Time Lost in the game:

L8.18.1.1 For all interruptions due to ground and/or weather conditions, or in the opinion of the umpires, other exceptional circumstances, the umpires should note the time lost during any suspension period.

L8.18.1.2 If such a game, as described in Rule L8.18.1.1, is interrupted for more than 30 minutes (*60 minutes for any games reduced by agreement to 30 overs or less*) accumulated time (the waiver time), the Duckworth Lewis Stern method shall be implemented. The amount of time lost in each suspension period beyond the waiver time, to be known as "relevant time lost", shall determine a revision to the number of overs remaining in the game.

L8.18.1.3 The tea interval and any break between innings whether they are combined or separate shall neither be considered as a Suspension Period.

L8.18.1.4 In the event that the side batting first is all out prior to commencement of their final over, there will be additional Waiver Time on the basis of 3 minutes for every full over remaining in the 1st innings at that time.

L8.18.1.5 The umpires shall inform the DLSMM of the number of overs lost during any suspension period before any recommencement of play. The DLSMM will record a new Suspension Period in the PCS App and,

if the 1st innings is complete calculate the Revised 1st Innings Total (RFIT).

L8.18.2 Interruptions in 1st Innings:

For every full 6 minutes of any relevant time lost, 1 over shall be deducted from both innings up until the scheduled completion of the first innings. After this, overs will be deducted as in Rule L8.18.3 below.

L8.18.3 Interruptions in 2nd Innings:

For every full 6 minutes of any relevant time lost 2 overs shall be deducted from the 2nd innings.

L8.18.4 Mid Over interruptions in play:

In a game interrupted in mid over by ground and/or weather conditions and resumption is within the same innings then the over in progress shall continue unless that part over is the only one remaining in the innings. In the latter case that innings shall be closed and if that were the 1st innings the length of the 2nd innings would be equal to the number of full overs played in the 1st innings.

L8.18.5 Any revised 1st innings total should be posted on the scoreboard, and checked by the umpires before play commences.

L8.18.6 The game is automatically abandoned when the total number of overs available for the 2nd Innings drops below 20 overs (provided a result has not previously been reached).

L8.18.7 If a minimum of 20 overs has been completed in the 2nd innings, and there is no further play, the DLSMM shall record a new suspension break in the PCS App stating "zero overs remaining". This will give a new RFIT which will determine the result.

L8.19 PERFORMANCE COLLECTIONS:

Collections may be taken for any of the following:

L8.19.1 Batsman scoring 50 runs.

L8.19.2 Bowler taking 5 wickets.

L8.19.3 Bowler performing the hat-trick.

L8.20 TEA INTERVAL:

L8.20.1 There shall be a tea interval of 30 minutes between innings. However, if mutually agreed by captains and umpires at the toss, this may be reduced to a minimum of 20 minutes at games where teas are not provided. Should the tea interval have already been taken during an interruption caused by adverse weather the interval between innings shall be ten minutes.

L8.20.2 Between innings the home team shall be responsible for the sweeping and rolling of the pitch and remarking of the creases. (See Rule L8.3.3)

L8.20.3 Any time lost between innings, and its cause, shall be reported by the umpires on the TMRF.

L8.20.4 Home clubs shall have the option as to whether they provide teas on match days.

L8.20.5 Home clubs opting to provide teas shall provide free teas for umpires and visiting scorer at all matches, and shall provide teas for the visiting teams, although there shall be no obligation for the visiting teams to purchase any teas.

L8.20.6 Clubs with teams wishing to provide teas during the season should inform the Administration Secretary by 1st April before the start of the season. A register of such teams will be posted on the League Website.

L8.21 DECLARATION OF INNINGS:

A team declaring its innings closed before the completion of its allotted overs shall be deemed to have lost all its wickets.

L8.22 COMPLETION OF TMRF:

L8.22.1 For all matches, including those not started or abandoned, a TMRF shall be completed by the home club. This must be fully completed (with full first names not initials) and signed by the Captain for each team, and handed to the Umpire(s) before commencement of play - Rule L8.6.1.

L8.22.2 The ages of all players who are under the age of 20 **MUST** be entered on the form. Where there is no age group entered against a player it will mean he is over the age of 19.

L8.22.3 Indemnity declaration on the TMRF can be seen below:

"I confirm that in line with Club policy, all players under the age of 18 will wear a helmet with a faceguard, together with a groin protector (box) when batting or when standing up to stumps when keeping wicket. *It is also strongly advised that neck protectors are worn with a helmet.*

I also confirm that the ECB Fast Bowling Directive applies to the players (aged 19 and under) together with the regulations regarding minimum fielding distances, as shown on the above team sheet. I also agree that prior to the toss, that I have discussed with the umpire(s) the Club's policy with regards to the wearing of helmets and the age groups of players taking part in the match. The Club hereby agrees to indemnify the Umpire(s) from and against all actions, costs, claims and demands (including reasonable legal fees), and any other damage suffered or incurred arising from any confirmation contained in this document."

L8.22.4 The Umpire(s) should complete and sign the TMRF after the game and return to the Home Captain. The home club should forward it by hand, post or email to: PHIL SENIOR, 5 Carr Mount, Upper Cumberworth, Huddersfield, HD8 8XN, email: phil.senior@davair.co.uk within 48 hours following the match.

L8.22.5 After the completion of the game, the result and scorecard for all matches, whenever played, must be fully completed on the club Play-Cricket website, by 12 noon on the day following the completion of the match. Incomplete and alternative formats will not be accepted.

L8.22.6 After the scorecard has been published on the League website, representatives from either competing clubs shall have 7 days to dispute any specific scorecard details. After this time the details shall not be altered.

L8.22.7 If a match does not take place for whatever reason, the TMRF, result and scorecard must still be completed and submitted.

L8.22.8 Any club failing to comply with any part of this Rule shall be fined £10 on each occasion of non-compliance.

L8.22.9 For each further week of non-compliance, any offending club will be fined an additional £10.

- L8.22.10 A player selected to play in a match which is abandoned due to adverse weather conditions, whether play has started or not, shall be deemed to have played if he is present when it is abandoned, and all such players shall be included on the TMRF notifying the abandonment.
- L8.22.11 Failure to comply with this Rule will result in any such selection being disregarded for the purposes of Rules L6.5.2 and C3.1.
- L8.22.12 If there are less than 7 players listed by a side on the TMRF at the time of abandonment, then that side shall be awarded no points.
- L8.22.13 A side listing 7 or more players shall receive 2 points for a match which is abandoned due to adverse weather.

L8.23 CRICKET CLOTHING DIRECTIVE:

All clubs are expected to adhere to the Cricket Clothing Advertising Directive. Clubs who fail to comply with this directive shall be subject to punitive measures as decided by the Executive Committee.

The Cricket Clothing Advertising Directive is produced below:

L8.23.1 Playing Shirts:

L8.23.1.1 Colour:

- Primarily white or ivory. 2 additional colours may be used in small sections for contrast detail including piping, trim, topstitching or panel inserts only.

L8.23.1.2 Club Badge:

- Must not exceed 10 square inches (64.52 sq. centimetres).
- Must be positioned on the left chest.
- Only one Club Badge may be used on each playing shirt.

L8.23.1.3 Manufacturers Mark:

- Must not exceed 6 square inches (38.71 sq centimetres).
- May be positioned on either the right chest or the Arm.

L8.23.1.4 Sponsor Mark - Front:

- Must not exceed 32 square inches (206.45 sq. centimetres).

L8.23.1.5 Sponsor Mark - Back:

- Must not exceed 20 square inches (129.03 sq. centimetres).
- Must be positioned centrally and immediately below the player's shirt collar.

L8.23.1.6 Sponsor Mark - Arms

- Must not exceed 10 square inches (64.52 sq. centimetres).

L8.23.1.7 Sponsor Mark - Collar

- Both left and right sides of the collar may be used.
- Each mark must not exceed 3 square inches (19.35 sq cm).
- Marks may be replicated on the underside of the collar. These must be identical in size, design and positioning to the marks on the topside of the collar.

L8.23.2 Sweaters (Sleeveless and Long Sleeve):

L8.23.2.1 Must be primarily white or ivory. The sweater must be a V-neck design. Additional stripes in team colours are permitted to be carried around the wrist cuffs, waist and neck. Where other colour is used, this should mirror the design of the Playing shirt.

L8.23.2.2 All Advertising Insignia and Club badges used on Sweaters should be to the exact specifications and locations as Advertising Insignia and Club badges used on playing shirts.

L8.23.3 Trousers:

L8.23.3.1 Must be primarily white or ivory. As per Playing Shirts, up to 2 additional colours (the same as those used on the playing shirt) may be used in small sections for contrast detail including piping, trim, topstitching or panel inserts only. Use of colour will be strictly limited and no large blocks of colour will be permitted.

L8.23.3.2 As per playing shirts, only one manufacturer's mark and one Club badge are permitted on playing trousers.

L8.23.3.3 No other commercial marks may appear on playing trousers

L8.23.4 T-Shirts and Base Layer Garments:

L8.23.4.1 Where the undergarment is not visible under the playing shirt, no colour restrictions will apply.

L8.23.4.2 Where a long sleeve undergarment is worn under a short sleeve playing shirt, any t-shirts or base layer garment must be white or ivory.

L8.23.5 Consistency of advertising logos - It is recommended that all flashes, logos and advertising should be identical for all players within any team

L8.23.6 Other types of advertising - There is no restriction whatsoever to advertising on tracksuits etc. that are not used on the field of play.

L8.24: Live Streaming and Filming of cricket matches:

L8.24.1 All Clubs that film or live stream cricket matches must inform the Administration Secretary as soon as practically possible. A register of such clubs will be circulated to all Clubs and the Umpires Association, along with the register also being displayed on the League website.

L8.24.2 All live streaming and filming of cricket matches must comply with privacy, data protection and safeguarding laws.

L8.24.3 Signage informing all persons present that filming is taking place must be prominently displayed at the ground.

L8.24.4 Visiting teams that intend to film/live stream a match must gain the express consent of the home Club and display signage as required under L8.24.3 above.

L8.24.5 Only if Rules L8.24.1 - L8.24.4 are adhered to can filming routinely take place.

L8.24.6 Filming may not take place on any occasion where before the game starts, either an Umpire or a junior player/parent object.

L8.24.7 Film footage must never be used to criticise, ridicule or vilify any participant, or for decision referral or challenge.

L8.24.8 The Executive have the authority to withdraw the automatic right of a club to film matches if they feel that the right to do so is being abused.

L8.25: PRACTICE DURING THE GAME:

Except when play is in progress, practice will be allowed on the playing area on the day of the match, but not on the square. When play is in progress, there will be no practice on the playing area.

L9 ADDITIONAL PROCEDURES - 2nd XIs ONLY

L9.1 PLAYER ELIGIBILITY:

- L9.1.1 On a date when a club's 1st XI has no match, or in any of the final six matches of the season, a player shall not be eligible to play in the club 2nd XI if more than 50% of the games in which he has played for the club in the season have been for the 1st XI or if more than 50% of the games that he has played in the immediately preceding 10 league games have been in the 1st XI.
- L9.1.1.1 No more than nine players shall be made ineligible by the provisions of this Rule.
- L9.1.1.2 If a club has more than nine such players this limitation will be implemented by excluding from ineligibility only the excess number of players who have the fewest 1st XI league appearances during the period of the club's immediately preceding Ten 1st XI League games.
- L9.1.1.3 If a player under disciplinary suspension during the immediately preceding 10 games would become eligible as a result of this suspension, then the player will, for the purpose of this rule, be deemed to have played in all games during their suspension.
- L9.1.2 Any Club playing two, or more, fewer players in its first team than in its second team on the same day shall be required to explain its reasons for doing so to the League Executive, and if the explanation is unacceptable, the 2nd XI will be deemed to have played an ineligible player.

L9.2 REGISTRATION ON THE DAY OF THE MATCH:

- L9.2.1 Subject to Rule L5.3.4 up to the time of the toss in any match a player, except under Rule L6.3.1 - County U12 player, and Rule L6.6.1 - overseas player, may be registered to play provided that the provisions of Rule L5.1, and the below, are met:
- L9.2.1.1 He is either not already registered with another club or, in respect of a transfer, all relevant parts of the RTDF have been completed.
- L9.2.1.2 The RTDF is fully completed before the scheduled start and signed by the captain of the opposing team.
- L9.2.1.3 The completed RTDF is sent by the player's club, either by First Class post or electronically, to be received by the Registration Secretary within 48 hours of the match, Sundays excepted.
- L9.2.1.4 The League Registered Player (LRP) nomination on the club's Play-Cricket website has been completed and received by the Registration Secretary within 48 hours of the match, Sundays excepted.
- L9.2.2 If the player is allowed to participate in the match without the procedure in Rule L9.2.1 being strictly followed he shall be deemed to be ineligible, and the provisions of Rule L6.2 shall apply.
- L9.2.3 No player registered in this manner shall play for the club's 1st XI until at least the Saturday after the initial match.

L10 UMPIRES

L10.1 APPOINTMENTS:

Umpires shall be appointed by the Umpires' Association Secretary.

L10.2 DUTIES:

The duties of the umpires shall be those laid down in the Laws of Cricket and any other duties contained in these Rules.

L10.3 TRAINING:

Upon joining the Association all new umpires MUST attend an ECB Umpires Course or an Umpires Development Course. To progress up the Umpires Pathway the ECB Umpires Course MUST be attended to obtain an initial grade. Further optional training courses will be available.

L10.4 REPORTING TO THE GROUND:

L10.4.1 Umpires shall report to the ground no later than 30 minutes before the scheduled start and be at the wickets five minutes before that time.

L10.4.2 If an appointed umpire fails to report on time the captains shall agree to a deputy who shall stand for the match or until the appointed umpire arrives. The matter shall be reported to the General Secretary by the home club.

L10.5 EXPENSES:

L10.5.1 The home club shall pay to the umpire(s), at or before the interval between innings, one of the following amounts in respect of all-inclusive expenses:

L10.5.1.1 Premiership match officiated by two umpires - **£67.00** each.

L10.5.1.2 Championship and Conference match officiated by two umpires - **£62.00** each.

L10.5.1.3 All Alliance matches officiated by two umpires - **£51.00** each.

L10.5.1.4 Any match officiated by one umpire: double all-inclusive expenses.

L10.5.1.5 Any scheduled match where no play is possible, with the exception of Rule L7.5.5: ½ of all-inclusive expenses.

L10.5.1.6 The home club may, at its discretion, make such payment as it thinks appropriate to any deputy umpire appointed under Rule L10.4.2.

L10.5.2 The above payments shall be amended each odd numbered year by applying the percentage change in the RPI for the preceding two-year period, November to October, and calculated to the nearest 50p.

L10.6 CLUB UMPIRES:

L10.6.1 *All Clubs must provide a Club Umpire to officiate at their 2nd XI fixtures both home and away. In addition, all Clubs with a 1st XI in the Alliance division must provide a second Club Umpire to officiate at those matches.*

L10.6.2 *Clubs with a 1st XI in the Conference must, when required to do so, request their Club Umpire steps up to officiate at their Conference fixtures. When this happens Clubs must still provide a Club Umpire to officiate at their 2nd XI game.*

L10.6.3 *In all cases, the Club Umpire must be aged 18 years of age or over, and hold a current ECB DBS certificate and be made a Member of their Club, in order to comply with, and be covered by the Club's Public Liability Insurance.*

L10.6.4 *Club Umpires should adhere to following dress code in all matches:*

- 1. Clean white jacket.*
 - 2. White polo shirt or white shirt & dark tie.*
 - 3. Black/Navy trousers.*
 - 4. White (or predominantly white) footwear.*
 - 5. Neat headwear (if worn). This must be predominantly white. Baseball style caps are also acceptable.*
- The necessity for both Umpires to wear matching attire is not required, so long as the items adhere to the above. Should one Umpire wish to wear a coat and the other a polo shirt/white shirt & tie, then this is acceptable.*

L10.6.5 Where a Club's 1st XI or 2nd XI is playing in the:

L10.6.5.1 Alliance, their Club Umpire must be trained to at least ECB ACO UDC (Umpire Development Course) Level (previously known as Level 1 or Stage 1 or Module C), or other suitable ECB approved training.

L10.6.5.2 Conference, their Club Umpire must be trained to at least ECB ACO Module B Level (previously known as Level 2 or Stage 2), or other suitable ECB approved training, and must also be a member of the ECB ACO.

L10.6.6 Club Umpires must be able to fulfil all duties of an official umpire, except on-field sanctions associated with Law 42, which must not be applied by a Club Umpire. Where a Club Umpire is paired with a UA Panel Umpire, the Panel Umpire will handle any on-field Law 42 matters, and decisions based upon conditions of ground, weather and light.

L10.6.7 If a qualified Club Umpire cannot be provided to officiate in a Conference fixture, the Club must provide a substitute who shall entirely officiate at square leg - the striker's end. The other Panel (or qualified regular Club) Umpire shall officiate at the bowling end. In such circumstances:

L10.6.7.1 the bowling end Umpire shall receive 1½ times all-inclusive expenses.

L10.6.7.2 the striker's end Umpire shall receive ½ of all-inclusive expenses.

L10.6.8 Except as detailed in Rule L10.6.7, both home and away team Club Umpires shall be entitled to all-inclusive expenses referred to in Rule L10.5.

L10.6.9 Clubs must record the names of all designated Club Umpires on their "About Us" page in Play-Cricket, and also register their names; DBS Certificate number(s) and ECB qualification(s) with the Administration Secretary by 1st April of each season. Club Umpires officiating in Conference matches must also register their ECB ACO membership number.

L10.6.10 If, in any season, a club fails to provide a Club Umpire on more than two occasions, it shall be fined, for the third and each subsequent transgression, a sum equal to the all-inclusive umpires' expenses referred to in Rule L10.5.1.2 and Rule L10.5.1.3 plus 33.33%, and calculated to the nearest £ above.

L10.6.11 All such fines imposed as per Rule L10.6.11, shall be separately audited and the total redistributed in equal shares, each October, to all clubs with a 100% Club Umpire provision rate.

L10.7 MISCONDUCT:

Players guilty of misconduct and any spectators who interfere with play, the players, or the umpires, shall be reported by the umpires to the Disciplinary Secretary.

L10.8 COMPLAINT AGAINST AN UMPIRE:

L10.8.1 A club wishing to make a complaint against an umpire shall give written notice to the Disciplinary Secretary, the Umpires Association Secretary and the umpire concerned, no later than seven days after the completion of the match to which the complaint relates.

L10.8.2 A fee of £20.00 shall be sent to the Disciplinary Secretary, and this fee shall be returned if the complaint is upheld.

L10.8.3 Any complaint shall be heard by an enquiry panel comprising the President or Chairman of the League, who shall act as chairman, together with the General Secretary, a member of the Executive and two members of the Umpires' Association. The findings of the panel shall be binding upon all parties and acted on by the Umpires' Association.

L10.9: MARKING OF UMPIRES:

All members of the Umpires' Association who officiate in Premiership and Championship games should be marked by the captains of the participating clubs, in line with **Who's The Umpire** criteria.

L10.10: STAND IN UMPIRES:

Any stand-in umpire who takes up the position at the striker's end, in any game (whether substituting for an absent Club Umpire, or a Panel Umpire) must be at least 18 years old.

L11 COMPLAINTS & DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

L11.1 COMPLAINT BY A CLUB:

L11.1.1 Any complaint by a club, other than one against an umpire, shall be in writing together with a fee of £20.00. This fee shall be returned if the complaint is upheld.

L11.1.2 The fee shall be sent to reach the Disciplinary Secretary no later than seven days after the completion of the match or event to which it relates, or in the case of a complaint made under Rule L6.2, no later than seven days after the club first became aware of the ineligibility of a player.

L11.1.3 A copy of the complaint shall be sent to the club and/or individuals concerned by the complaining club.

L11.2 DISCIPLINARY REPORT BY AN UMPIRE:

L11.2.1 A Disciplinary Report submitted by an umpire regarding the conduct of a player, coach, club or spectator on or around the field of play shall be sent to the Disciplinary Secretary with a copy sent to the Secretary of the Umpires' Association.

L11.2.2 The Report shall be dealt with in accordance with the ECB General Conduct Regulations, which are binding on both the League and all member clubs. The regulations are appended to this handbook, and may be viewed on the League website.

L11.3 DISCIPLINARY HEARINGS:

L11.3.1 Following the receipt of a report the Disciplinary Secretary shall consider if there are sufficient grounds to charge the relevant participant or club with a breach of the regulations.

L11.3.2 If there are sufficient grounds the Disciplinary Secretary will issue a Charge Letter to the participant/s and/or to the club involved to share with the participant/s. If there are not, sufficient grounds the Disciplinary Secretary will inform the individual who submitted the report that no further action will be taken.

L11.3.3 If the Disciplinary Secretary decides that the matter does not require a Hearing the Summary Procedure in Regulations 15-20 shall apply. If the Disciplinary Secretary decides that the matter requires a Hearing, Regulations 21-30 shall apply

L11.4 APPEALS PROCESS

Any respondent may appeal against a decision made by a Disciplinary Chair or Panel in accordance with Regulations 31-45. Any appeal shall be in writing and sent to the Disciplinary Secretary, clearly setting out the grounds for the appeal, and shall be made within 7 days of the notification of the decision. A fee of £100 must be included with the appeal, which will be returned should the appeal be successful.

L11.5 APPEALS AGAINST AN EXECUTIVE DECISION:

L11.5.1 A club which is aggrieved by a decision of the Executive may appeal to the Council, with a fee of £20. Any appeal shall be sent to the Administration Secretary within seven days of the notification of the decision. The decision of the Council shall be final and binding.

L11.6 THE POWER OF THE EXECUTIVE UNDER THIS RULE:

- L11.6.1 In the event of the Executive being made aware of any incident, not previously reported formally, which is a breach of the Laws of Cricket, or of these Rules, or is degrading or detrimental to the game or the League, it shall proceed as if a formal complaint or Disciplinary Report had been made.
- L11.6.2 The Executive shall have the power to impose any penalty or fine, to award or deduct points and/or to order any match to be replayed.
- L11.6.3 The Executive shall have the power to reduce or waive any penalty or fine laid down in these Rules.

L11.7 RELEASE OF INFORMATION:

The release of information regarding disciplinary proceedings taken against an individual shall be at the discretion of the Executive. In general, the circumstances of cases shall not be made public. However, the outcome of any Disciplinary Sanctions applied will be reported to ECB via the Play-Cricket Disciplinary Register.

L11.8 WTU and GCR related Team Points Deduction System:

- L11.8.1 This rule shall apply to Premiership and Championship League games and teams only.
- L11.8.2 Team League points will be deducted based on an accumulation of Team Penalties.
- L11.8.3 Team Penalties are awarded against teams for either of the following:
- L11.8.3.1 Teams awarded low **Who's The Umpire** Fair Play scores.
 - L11.8.3.1.1 For any WTU Fair Play score of 11 - 8 (out of 20) the team will be issued with 1 Team Penalty.
 - L11.8.3.1.2 For any WTU Fair Play score of 7 - 0 (out of 20) the team will be issued with 3 Team Penalties.
 - L11.8.3.2 Disciplinary sanctions issued against individual players under ECB GCR Disciplinary Procedures:
 - L11.8.3.2.1 "Reminded of Responsibilities" 0 Team Penalty.
 - L11.8.3.2.2 Formal Warning 1 Team Penalty.
 - L11.8.3.2.3 Suspended Sanction 2 Team Penalties
 - L11.8.3.2.4 Level 1 Sanction 3 Team Penalties.
 - L11.8.3.2.5 Level 2 Sanction 6 Team Penalties.
 - L11.8.3.2.6 Level 3 Sanction 9 Team Penalties.
 - L11.8.3.2.7 Level 4 Sanction 12 Team Penalties.

L11.8.4 The total number of League Points Deducted from a team is based on the Accumulated Team Penalties awarded against a team. See the table:

L11.8.5 Administration

L11.8.5.1 The Administration Secretary will inform the relevant Club Secretary via email, within 72 hours of the completion of the game, that their team has, as a result of a low WTU Fair play score, received a Team Penalty.

L11.8.5.2 Team Penalties flowing from player Disciplinary cases will be confirmed in the case Outcome Letter.

L11.8.5.3 League Division tables will be updated immediately it has been confirmed that a Team has incurred a League Division points deduction.

L11.8.6 Any Penalties, and any resulting Team Points deducted from a Team during the season are only effective within the season they are awarded, and do not continue forward into the following season.

L11.9 PERSISTENT BREACHES OF RULES:

Any club which is guilty of persistent breaches of these Rules may be expelled from the League provided that at least two-thirds of the clubs vote in favour.

L12 RULES & ALTERATIONS

L12.1 QUESTIONS ON THESE RULES:

The Executive shall have the power to decide any question arising on the construction of, or any matter which is not provided for in, these Rules and, subject to Rule L3.5.4, that decision shall be final.

L12.2 ADOPTION OF RULES:

Any of these Rules may be altered or deleted and new Rules made either at the AGM or at an SGM, provided that at least two-thirds of the votes cast are in favour.

L12.3 RULE PROPOSALS DEADLINE DATE:

Written notice of any proposed alteration or deletion of a Rule, or of any proposed new Rule, shall be given to the Administration Secretary by not later than 5 days after the final scheduled league game of the season, in the case of an AGM, or at least three weeks before any SGM called for this purpose. Full details of the proposal(s) shall be sent at least four weeks before an AGM, or three weeks before any SGM.

L12.4 SUBMISSION OF VOTES BY CLUBS:

L12.4.1 Each club shall send to the Administration Secretary its recorded vote(s) at least two weeks before an AGM or at least one week before any SGM.

L12.4.2 Any club failing to comply with the requirement of Rule L12.4.1 shall be fined £20.

L12.5 PROPOSED ALTERATION TO THE SAME RULE:

Each club submitting a proposed alteration to a Rule for consideration at an AGM shall be notified in writing, not later than 30th September, of any other proposed alteration to the same Rule.

L12.6 EXECUTIVE EXPERIMENTAL RULE CHANGE:

The Executive may, at its discretion, introduce a Rule on an experimental basis only, without it being formally incorporated in the Rules proper. If approved and implemented any experimental Rule shall be reviewed after one year of operation. No experimental Rule shall be formally incorporated in the Rules proper, unless the appropriate procedures detailed in Rules L12.2 to L12.4 have been followed.

L13 ANNUAL AWARDS & TROPHIES

L13.1 ANNUAL DINNER:

L13.1.1 The Executive shall determine the awards and trophies to be presented annually at the 'League Dinner and Presentation Evening', normally to be held on the second Friday in November.

L13.1.2 The Executive shall be responsible for all presentation arrangements.

L13.1.3 Each club must purchase a minimum of 4 tickets.

L13.2 PUBLICATION OF AWARDS:

A description of all current awards and trophies, and the competitions or performances to which they relate, shall be published annually in the League Yearbook together with a chronology of previous winners.

L13.3 AWARDS BY ASSESSMENT:

L13.3.1 Where the winner(s) of an award or trophy is (are) to be determined by assessment, rather than by reference to factual data, these shall be judged by the Executive except for:

L13.3.2 The Lady Sykes Trophies & F.R. Stallard Cup (Senior Awards Sub-Committee consisting of the President, a Life Vice-President and the Chairman).

L13.3.3 The Tim Sugden Administration Award (The Secretariat).

L13.3.4 The David Boulton Trophy (UA).

L13.4 NOMINATIONS FOR AWARDS:

Any nominations for the Lady Sykes Trophies, F.R. Stallard Cup and Johnny Hunter Rose bowls shall be given to the Administration Secretary by not later than 30th September.

L13.5 COSTS OF AWARDS & ENGRAVING:

The cost of all awards or trophies (other than those donated) and all engraving costs shall be met from League funds. The engraving of any trophy shall be arranged immediately following presentation, and shall be the responsibility of the (player's) club by ensuring it is delivered to Cobwood Trophies & Engravers, Milnsbridge, for updating.

L13.6 RECEIPT OF AWARDS:

Each award or trophy shall be held for up to twelve months but shall remain the property of the League.

L13.7 AWARD WINNERS TIEBREAKERS:

- L13.7.1 For any Wicket-keepers with the same number of League victims or Fielders with the same number of League catches, the winner will be the player who has played in the fewer number of League games. Should this be the same, then the award will be shared.
- L13.7.2 In the event of there being a non-qualifier for a specific batting or bowling League award, the winner will be the best non qualifier who has achieved the most runs or wickets. If in this situation there is a tie, the winner will be determined by the individual with the best average.

L13.8 OVERSEAS PLAYERS:

No overseas player (Category 3 player) is eligible to win any League Award other than the Overseas Player of the year award.

L13.9 INSURANCE:

Each trophy shall be insured by the League but the (player's) club concerned shall be responsible for its safe custody and upkeep whilst in (his) its possession.

L13.10 RETURN OF TROPHIES:

- L13.10.1 Trophies must be returned by the club in the same condition as when presented.
- L13.10.2 Any club failing to comply with Rule L13.10.1 will be responsible for the cost of any necessary repairs and/or a £10 fine in lieu of cleaning costs.
- L13.10.3 Clubs must return the following trophies to Cobwood Trophies & Engravers, Milnsbridge, by the given dates of the year after the award was presented.
- L13.10.3.1 All cup knockout winner's trophies (Sykes Cup, Paddock Shield, T20 Trophy, T20 Shield, Oddfellows Cup and Earnshaw Cup), and the Roger France Trophy - Sykes Cup Final Player of the Match by 1st July.
- L13.10.3.2 All League winner's trophies by 1st August.
- L13.10.4 Clubs must return the following trophies to Cobwood Trophies & Engravers, Milnsbridge by the given dates of the year after the award was presented.
- L13.10.4.1 Hopkinson Trophy and Schweppes Cup by 1st October.
- L13.10.4.2 All individual and general trophies by 1st October.
- L13.10.4.2.1 Should an individual move to a new club after the award of a trophy, it is the responsibility of his current club to ensure its safe return.
- L13.10.5 Failure to meet any of the deadlines in Rule L13.10.3 and Rule L13.10.4 will result in a £10 fine per trophy for the club, which will be doubled for any further weeks that any trophy fails to be returned.
- L13.10.6 If a club which is the holder of a trophy ceases to be member of the League the trophy shall be returned to the General Secretary within seven days of the termination of the club's membership.
- L13.10.7 If a player's registration is cancelled during a season, he shall not be eligible to receive any individual award or trophy for that season.

SYKES CUP

C1 TITLE & CONSTITUTION

C1.1 COMPETITION NAME:

C1.1.1 The competition shall be called the Sykes Cup (the Competition).

C1.2 COMPETITION RULES:

C1.2.1 All ties shall be under the control of the Executive.

C1.2.2 At all times, ties in the Competition shall take precedence over the T20 Trophy or Shield, and all non-domestic competitions.

C1.2.3 League Rules shall apply, where appropriate, except for:

C1.2.3.1 Rule L8.5.6 - pitch deemed unsuitable after start of play.

C1.2.3.2 Rule L8.11.1 - "15 over limit/bowler", and also except as provided below:

C1.3 QUALIFYING TEAMS:

C1.3.1 It shall be a knockout Competition for the 16 highest finishing 1st XI teams from the previous season, after promotion and relegation have been taken into consideration.

C1.4 COMPETITION ACCOUNTS:

The accounts of the Competition shall be included in the Annual Statement of Finance presented at the AGM, and if this be adopted, any surplus shall then be transferred to League funds.

C2 DRAWS & TIES

C2.1 DRAWS:

The draw for Round 1 shall be made at the AGM, with subsequent rounds being drawn on the Wednesday following the date of the previous round at a scheduled Council meeting, a convened Executive meeting or a meeting convened for the purpose of the draw.

C2.2 VENUES FOR TIES OTHER THAN THE FINAL:

In all rounds prior to the final all ties shall be played on the ground of the club drawn first.

C2.3 ADMISSION FEES:

C2.3.1 Admission fees for rounds prior to the semi-final shall be the same as those charged for League matches

C2.3.2 Admission fees for the semi-final and final shall be fixed by the Executive.

C2.3.3 Fees for admission to all or part of the second innings only in an extended tie shall be half the normal scale.

C2.4 GATE RECEIPTS:

C2.4.1 For the semi-finals and final the Executive shall arrange for the collection of gate receipts.

C2.4.2 After the payment of all expenses the four teams shall each receive 10% of the net receipts from the semi-finals and the two teams 10% each of the net receipts from the final. The surplus, after payment to clubs shall be placed in the Competition account for the season.

C2.5 VENUE FOR THE FINAL:

The venue for the final shall be selected by the Executive and announced at least twelve weeks in advance of the scheduled date.

C2.6 MATCH BALLS FOR THE FINAL:

The match balls for the final shall be provided by the Executive.

C2.7 COUNTER ATTRACTIONS ON THE SCHEDULED DAY OF THE FINAL:

C2.7.1 Clubs may stage or host any non-cricket event or function on the scheduled day of the final.

C2.7.2 Clubs wishing to hold, or allow to be held, an organised cricket match on its cricket ground on the scheduled day of the final must apply for and be granted permission by the Executive. Any request must be made to the Executive by the date of the August Executive Meeting, and all requests will be considered on a case-by-case basis. The granting of permission to hold matches, which do not undermine the prestige of the Sykes Cup Final or detract from interest in it, will not be unreasonably refused.

C3 PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

C3.1 PRE-SEASON REGISTRATIONS:

All players who are registered by midnight on the Friday prior to the start of the season shall be eligible to play in the Competition during that season without restriction, with the exception of *Category 2 and Category 3 players*, who shall be subject to the provisions of Rule C3.2.

C3.2 IN SEASON REGISTRATIONS:

A player registered after the start of a season, or a *Category 2 or Category 3 player*, whenever registered, shall also be eligible provided that, during the season, he has played for his club in the qualifying number of League and/or Cup/Shield matches specified below (or appeared on a TMRF for an abandoned match in accordance with League Rule L8.22.10) prior to the scheduled date of the round in which he plays:

C3.2.1 In Round 1 - one prior League match played.

C3.2.2 Quarter-Final - three prior League or Cup/Shield matches played.

C3.2.3 Semi-Final - four prior League or Cup/Shield matches played.

C3.2.4 By the Final - must have qualified under either Rules C3.1 or C3.2.3.

C3.3 RESTRICTIONS ON PLAYER SELECTION:

No player shall play for both his club's teams in the same or corresponding rounds of the Sykes Cup, Oddfellows Cup, Paddock Shield and Earnshaw Cup competitions, nor shall any player play for more than one club in these competitions during the same season.

C3.4 INELIGIBLE PLAYERS:

Any team playing an ineligible player shall forfeit the tie and be fined £20.

C4 MATCH PROCEDURES

C4.1 START TIMES:

Ties shall be played on the dates arranged by the Executive. Subject to Rules C4.2, and C4.3 below all ties shall start at 12.30pm, except the Sykes Cup Final which will start at 12 Noon.

C4.2 TIES - PLAYING CONDITIONS:

C4.2.1 DELAYED START:

For a delayed start 1 over per side will be deducted for every 6 minutes lost up to a minimum of a 20 overs per side match. The tea interval is not included in

- any deduction - latest start 4.00pm. In the Final, overs will not be deducted until 1.00pm, and special regulations may apply.
- C4.2.2 TIE NOT STARTING ON THE SCHEDULED DATE or WHERE 10 OVERS HAVE NOT BEEN COMPLETED:
- C4.2.2.1 Shall be declared void, and rearranged on the following Sunday or Bank Holiday Monday.
- C4.2.2.2 Play in such rearranged ties shall start at 12.30pm, except in the case of Bank Holiday Monday ties where the start shall be by mutual agreement but no later than 6.30pm.
- C4.2.2.3 Whilst all other provisions of Rule L8.20 shall be met; it is not necessary to list any players in the submission of the required TMRF.
- C4.2.3 INTERRUPTED GAMES:
- C4.2.3.1 Time Lost in the game:
- C4.2.3.1.1 For all interruptions due to ground and/or weather conditions the umpires should note the time lost during any suspension period.
- C4.2.3.1.2 In a game interrupted by ground and/or weather conditions Duckworth Lewis Stern shall be implemented. There shall be NO WAIVER TIME. The amount of time lost in each suspension period, to be known as "relevant time lost", shall determine a revision to the number of overs remaining in the game.
- C4.2.3.1.3 The tea interval and any break between innings whether they are combined or separate shall neither be considered as a Suspension Period.
- C4.2.3.1.4 The umpires shall inform the DLSMM of the number of overs lost during any suspension period before any recommencement of play. The DLSMM will record a new Suspension Period in the PCS App and, if the 1st innings is complete calculate the Revised First Innings Total (RFIT).
- C4.2.3.2 Interruptions in 1st Innings:
For every full 6 minutes of any relevant time lost, 1 over shall be deducted from both innings up until the scheduled completion of the first innings. After this, overs will be deducted as in Rule C4.3.2.3 below.
- C4.2.3.3 Interruptions in 2nd Innings:
For every full 6 minutes of any relevant time lost 2 overs shall be deducted from the 2nd innings.
- C4.2.3.4 Mid Over interruptions in play:
In a game interrupted in mid over by ground and/or weather conditions and resumption is within the same innings then the over in progress shall continue unless that part over is the only one remaining in the innings. In the latter case that innings shall be closed and if that were the 1st innings the length of the 2nd innings would be equal to the number of full overs played in the 1st innings.
- C4.2.3.5 Any revised 1st innings total should be posted on the scoreboard, and checked by the umpires before play commences.

C4.2.3.6 **If a minimum of 20 overs** has been completed in the 2nd innings, and there is no further play on that day, the DLSMM shall record a new suspension break in the PCS App stating "zero overs remaining". This will give a new RFIT which will determine the result.

*This limit of 20 overs may be reduced to the actual number of 2nd innings overs that have been completed, providing that BOTH team captains agree.

C4.2.3.7 In the event of a tie not being completed on the scheduled, or re-arranged date due to inclement weather and where at **least 10 overs have been completed** the following shall apply (Note C4.2.3.6*):

C4.2.3.7.1 Play shall continue as necessary on the following day(s), unless there is a scheduled League fixture.

C4.2.3.7.2 Evening play in such extended ties shall start at 6.30pm, or earlier by mutual agreement, and on Sundays at 1.00pm. Play on Fridays shall also be by mutual agreement.

C4.2.3.7.3 When a game is continued beyond the original scheduled day, play shall recommence under the same assumption that the last ball was bowled on the scheduled day, or on the last day that the tie had continued.

C4.2.4 TIES NOT COMPLETED AT THE SECOND ATTEMPT:

Shall continue as Rule C4.2 above.

C4.3 TIES WHERE EXTENDED PLAY IS REQUIRED:

C4.3.1 Any interval between innings shall be ten minutes.

C4.3.2 If the first innings closes after 8.30pm the captain of the team batting second shall have the option of starting his team's innings the next day.

C4.3.3 The pitch shall be swept and rolled for at least five minutes after the close of play each day, and may then be covered.

C4.3.4 Before the start of each succeeding day's play the pitch shall be cut, and then rolled for not more than seven minutes. This maintenance shall take place in the presence of the umpires.

C4.4 "LEG SIDE WIDE":

All deliveries passing wide of the leg stump, and outside the line of the batsman's body, that do not come into contact with the bat or any part of the batsman's person, shall be called WIDE.

C4.5 RESTRICTIONS ON THE PLACEMENT OF FIELDERS:

C4.5.1 A FIELDING ZONE shall be drawn on the field of play. This shall consist of two semi-circles having respective centres at each middle stump, and joined by a parallel line on each side of the pitch.

The radius of each of the circles shall be 30 yards, but where any part of this zone would impinge within five yards of the boundary line then it shall be drawn at that limitation. The perimeter of the fielding zone shall be marked by a series of white discs.

C4.5.2 "POWER PLAY OVERS":

C4.5.2.1 For the first 15 overs of each innings only 2 fielders shall be permitted outside the zone at the instant of delivery. In the event of any infringement, the umpire at square leg shall call and signal "no ball".

C4.5.2.2 In any game delayed or interrupted by ground and/or weather conditions the "power play" overs shall be revised as follows:

C4.5.3 For each over following the fifteenth over (or revised power play over), a minimum of 4 fielders (plus the bowler and the wicketkeeper) must be inside the fielding at the instant of delivery. In the event of any infringement the umpire at square leg shall call and signal "no ball".

C4.5.4 At the instant of delivery there shall be no more than 5 fielders on the leg side. In the event of any infringement the umpire at square leg shall call and signal "no ball".

C4.6 NUMBER OF OVERS PER BOWLER:

C4.6.1 Each bowler shall be allowed to bowl a maximum of 10 overs.

C4.6.2 In the event of a bowler breaking down and being unable to complete an over, the remaining balls will be allowed by another bowler. Such part of an over will count as a full over only in so far as each bowler's limit is concerned.

C4.6.3 Maximum overs allowance per bowler in a delayed or interrupted match:

C4.6.3.1 Where overs are reduced for either team, no bowler may bowl more than one-fifth of the total overs allowed. Where the total overs are not divisible by 5, one additional over shall be allowed to the maximum number per bowler necessary to make up the balance.

C4.6.3.2 Any incomplete over at the time of a stoppage due to inclement weather, must be completed by the same bowler at the restart of play, even though this could take him beyond any newly calculated maximum overs per bowler.

C4.7 THE RESULT:

C4.7.1 The team making the higher score in each tie shall be the winners, irrespective of the number of wickets lost.

C4.7.2 If the scores finish level the winners shall be the team who has lost the least number of wickets per over. Note that injured or absent players are wickets lost only in the case of a team being all out or declaring their innings closed.

C4.7.3 If both teams have lost the same number of wickets per over, the winners will be decided by a 'bowl out', organised by the umpires and using the procedure below in Rule C4.8.

C4.7.4 If in exceptional circumstances, the umpires deem it impractical to conduct a bowl out the winner shall be decided by the toss of a coin.

C4.8 BOWL OUT PROCEDURES:

C4.8.1 The umpires shall arrange a suitable site and oversee the bowl out.

C4.8.2 The captains shall nominate their five bowlers and the order of bowling. They must then inform each other and the umpires prior to the toss. In the event

of injury during the bowl out, the injured player may be replaced by another bowler, but not one of the previously nominated five.

- C4.8.3 The captains shall toss a coin for the right to decide which team bowls first in the bowl out.
- C4.8.4 Wicketkeepers must stand at least 5yards behind the stumps.
- C4.8.5 Each delivery should be fair and must pitch in front of popping crease.
- C4.8.6 If a bowler bowls a 'wide' or a 'no ball' it will count as a miss with no re-bowl permitted.
- C4.8.7 The umpires must take up positions as in a normal game. The umpire at square leg will be responsible for ruling on the bounce of the ball.
- C4.8.8 All bowlers, except the one who is next to deliver, must take up a position by the square leg umpire. All other players must be clear of the playing area, and as instructed by the umpires.
- C4.8.9 The nominated bowlers from each side will then bowl one delivery over-arm. This will be done alternatively following the order of bowling as given before. A dislodged bail will constitute a hit.
- C4.8.10 The side which bowls down the wicket most times shall be the winner.
- C4.8.11 If the scores are level after all 5 players have bowled, the 'bowl out' will continue until a result is achieved on a 'sudden death' basis using the same 5 bowlers in the same order.

C4.9 MATCH BALLS:

In all ties, except the final, each team shall use its own new Dukes County International 'A' cricket ball. which is approved by the Executive, and purchased from the League. The Executive will provide match balls in the Final - Rule C2.6.

C5 UMPIRES

C5.1 EXPENSES:

- C5.1.1 For all ties, standard all-inclusive expenses as detailed in Rule L10.5.1.1 shall be paid to each umpire. **(For 2026: £67)**
- C5.1.2 In any extended tie additional travelling expenses shall be paid for each further day that they are in attendance.
- C5.1.3 For ties prior to the semi-final the home club will be liable for the payment of both umpires.
- C5.1.4 The Executive shall be responsible for all costs in the semi-finals and final, and for the provision and presentation of suitable mementoes to the appointed umpires in the final.

C5.2 EXTENDED TIES:

- C5.2.1 In any extended tie the umpires shall note the current status of play, and must take charge of the ball(s) used.
- C5.2.2 They shall also ensure that any pitch maintenance undertaken at the close of play, and at the start of each succeeding day's play, is carried out in accordance with Rules C4.3.3 and C4.3.4.

C6 COMPLAINTS & PENALTIES

- C6.1** Any complaint shall be made in accordance with Rule L11.1. However, in the case of a tie completed less than seven days before the next round, any complaint shall be handed to the Administration Secretary within 24 hours of completion of the tie.

C6.2 Any matter which is not expressly provided for in these Cup Rules or in the League Rules shall be decided as the Executive think proper.

C7 TROPHIES

C7.1 The team winning the Competition shall receive the Sir Charles Sykes Cup and be entitled to hold the trophy until 1st July of the following season.

C7.2 Both finalists shall each be presented with 13 individual trophies.

C7.3 The Roger France Trophy shall be presented to the individual who is adjudged to have been the Player of the Final.

S1 TITLE & CONSTITUTION

S1.1 COMPETITION NAME:

The competition shall be called the *Fired Up Corporation* Paddock Shield (the Competition).

S1.2 COMPETITION RULES:

It shall be subject in every particular to the Rules of the Sykes Cup competition **except for:**

S1.2.1 Rule C1.1 - Competition title.

S1.2.5 Rule C2.4.1 - The Executive to take a Gate for the Final only.

S1.2.3 Rule C2.7 - Permission to play cricket matches on the day of the Final.

S1.2.4 Rule C4.5.2 - Power Play Overs.

S1.2.2 Rule C4.6 - Maximum overs per bowler.

S1.2.7 Rule C5.1.1 - Umpires expenses.

S1.2.6 Rule C5.1.4 - The Executive to be responsible for costs in the Final only, and except as provided below:

NOTE: Rule L8.12 - "Leg Side Wides" and Rule L8.13.3 "No more than 5 fielders on the leg side" fielders" to apply.

S1.3 QUALIFYING TEAMS:

S1.3.1 It shall be a knockout Competition for the 16 highest finishing 2nd XI teams from the previous season, after promotion and relegation have been taken into consideration.

S2 DRAWS & TIES

S2.1 DRAWS:

S2.1.1 The draw for Round 1 will be made at the AGM with subsequent draws being made at the discretion of the Executive.

S2.1.2 Where appropriate, the numbers of the teams drawn at home in Round 1 of the Sykes Cup competition, shall be placed in a designated away bag. From those remaining in the home bag, teams shall be transferred at random to the away bag until the two bags contain an equal number of teams. The draw shall then take place with teams drawn from the home and away bags alternately.

S2.2 TIES:

For ties in the first, second and quarter-final rounds, any club whose 1st XI has been drawn at home in the Sykes Cup competition, shall be placed in the away bag, and the process described in Rule S2.1.2 repeated. For the semi-finals and the final, the team drawn first in each pairing shall have home advantage

S3 PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

S3.1 Any player, who is Sykes Cup qualified, shall be eligible to play in the Competition should both 1st and 2nd XI's have ties on the same day or in the same corresponding round.

S3.2 If the 1st XI did not enter, or has previously been eliminated from the Sykes Cup and Oddfellows Cup competitions, no player shall be eligible to play in the Competition from the 2nd Round onwards if he has played more 1st XI games in League and Cup Competitions than 2nd XI games in League and Cup Competitions.

S3.3 If a club playing in the 1st Round of the Competition, has no 1st X1 playing in the 1st Round of the Sykes Cup or *Oddfellows Cup*, then Rule L9.1 will apply.

S4 MATCH PROCEDURE

S4.1 START TIMES:

All ties will start at 1.00pm, including the Final.

S4.2 LENGTH OF INNINGS:

Each team shall bowl a maximum of 45 overs

S4.3 NUMBER OF OVERS PER BOWLER:

S4.3.1 Each bowler be allowed to bowl a maximum of nine overs.

S4.3.2 If the overs are reduced due to a delayed start, an agreed reduction of overs or by interruptions to games, then the maximum overs per bowler shall be reduced by one over for every five overs deducted. Where the total overs are not divisible by 5, one additional over shall be allowed to the maximum number per bowler necessary to make up the balance.

S4.4 MATCH BALLS:

In all ties each team shall use its own ball. It shall be a new Readers Sovereign Grade 'A' cricket ball, or a ball of acceptable quality approved by the Executive and purchased from the League.

S5 UMPIRES

S5.1 EXPENSES:

S5.1.1 For all ties, standard all-inclusive expenses as detailed in Rule L10.5.1.3 shall be paid to each umpire. **(For 2026: £51)**

S5.1.2 For ties prior to the Final the home club will be liable for the payment of both umpires.

S5.2 EXTENDED TIES:

Extended Ties will be as per Rule C5.2.

S6 TROPHIES

S6.1 The team winning the Competition will receive the *Fired Up Corporation* Paddock Shield and be entitled to hold the trophy until 1st July of the following season.

S6.2 Both finalists shall each be presented with 13 individual trophies.

S6.3 A special award shall be presented to the individual who is adjudged to have been the player of the Final.

ODDFELLOWS CUP

OC1 TITLE & CONSTITUTION

OC1.1 COMPETITION NAME:

The competition shall be called the Oddfellows Cup (the Competition).

OC1.2 COMPETITION RULES:

It shall be subject in every particular to the Rules of the Sykes Cup, except Rules C2.4.1 & C2.4.2 (Gate Receipts); C5.1.1 (Umpires' Expenses) and as shown below:

OC1.3 QUALIFYING TEAMS:

It shall be a knockout competition of all 1st teams not qualified to enter the Sykes Cup competition after promotion and relegation have been taken into account.

OC1.4 BYES:

Byes into Round 2 are to be given to the highest qualifying finishing teams from the previous league season, to ensure a group of 16 teams in Round 2.

OC2 DRAWS & TIES

OC2.1 DRAWS:

OC2.1. The draw for Round 1 will be made at the AGM with subsequent draws being made at the discretion of the Executive.

OC2.2 TIES:

In all rounds including the Final, the team drawn first shall have home advantage.

OC3 PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

OC3.1 Player Eligibility will be as per Sykes Cup Rule C3, but with the following adaptations for in Season Registrations eligibility:

OC3.1.1 Round 1 - one prior League match played.

OC3.1.2 Round 2 - two prior League or Cup/Shield matches played.

OC3.1.3 Quarter-Final - three prior League or Cup/Shield matches played.

OC3.1.4 Semi-Final - four prior League or Cup/Shield matches played.

OC3.1.5 By the Final - must have qualified under either Rules C3.1 or OC3.1.4.

OC4 MATCH PROCEDURE

OC4.1 START TIMES:

All ties will start at 12.30pm including the Final.

OC4.2 PLAYING CONDITIONS:

All other Playing conditions shall be as per Sykes Cup Rule C4.

OC4.3 MATCH BALLS:

In all ties each team shall use its own new Reader Sovereign Grade 'A' cricket ball which is approved by the Executive, and purchased from the League, *or by mutual agreement teams may use Dukes County International 'A' cricket balls.*

OC5 UMPIRES

OC5.1 EXPENSES:

For all ties, standard all-inclusive expenses as detailed in Rule L10.5.1.2 shall be paid by the Home Club to each umpire. **(For 2026: £62)**

OC5.2 EXTENDED TIES:

Extended Ties will be as per Rule C5.2.

OC6 TROPHIES

OC6.1 The team winning the Competition will receive the Oddfellows Cup, and be entitled to hold the trophy until 1st July of the following season.

OC6.2 Both finalists shall each be presented with 13 individual trophies.

EARNSHAW CUP

EC1 TITLE & CONSTITUTION

EC1.1 COMPETITION NAME:

The competition shall be called the Earnshaw Cup (the Competition).

EC1.2 COMPETITION RULES:

It shall be subject in every particular to the Rules of the Paddock Shield.

except for:

EC1.2.1 Rule S1.2.1 - Competition title.

EC1.3 QUALIFYING TEAMS:

It shall be a knockout competition of all 2nd teams not qualified to enter the Paddock Shield competition after promotion and relegation have been taken into account.

EC1.4 BYES: Byes into Round 2 are to be given to the highest qualifying finishing teams from the previous season, to ensure a group of 16 teams in Round 2.

EC2 DRAWS & TIES

EC2.1 DRAWS:

The draw for Round 1 of the Competition shall be made after the completion of Round 1 of the Paddock Shield, with subsequent draws being made at the discretion of the Executive.

S2.2 TIES:

EC2.2.1 First, Second and Third Round Ties:

Any club whose 1st XI has been drawn at home in the Sykes Cup or Oddfellows Cup competitions, shall be placed in the away bag. From those remaining in the home bag, teams shall be transferred at random to the away bag until the two bags contain an equal number of teams. The draw shall then take place with teams drawn from the home and away bags alternately.

EC2.2.2 Semi-Final & Final ties:

The team drawn first in each pairing shall have home advantage.

EC3 PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

EC3.1 Any player, who is Sykes Cup qualified, shall be eligible to play in the Competition should both 1st and 2nd XIs have ties on the same day or in the same corresponding round.

EC3.2 If the 1st X1 has previously been eliminated from the Sykes Cup or Oddfellows Cup competitions, no player shall be eligible to play in the Competition from the 1st round onwards if he/she has played more 1stXI games in the League, Sykes Cup or Oddfellows Cup than 2ndXI games in the League, Paddock Shield and Earnshaw Cup.

EC3.3 Special exemption is made exclusively for Round 1 whereby a player must be registered, but is not subject to having played any qualification games. Thus, a Player may register to play in the 1st Round of the Competition subject to Rule L9.2 (on day Registration).

EC4 MATCH PROCEDURE

EC4.1 START TIMES:

All ties will start at 1.00pm, including the Final.

EC4.2 LENGTH OF INNINGS:

Each team shall bowl a maximum of 45 overs.

EC4.3 NUMBER OF OVERS PER BOWLER:

EC4.3.1 Each bowler be allowed to bowl a maximum of nine overs.

EC4.3.2 If the overs are reduced due to a delayed start, an agreed reduction of overs or by interruptions to games, then the maximum overs per bowler shall be reduced by one over for every five overs deducted. Where the total overs are not divisible by 5, one additional over shall be allowed to the maximum number per bowler necessary to make up the balance.

EC4.3 MATCH BALLS:

In all ties each team shall use its own ball. It shall be a new Readers Sovereign Grade 'A' cricket ball, or a ball of acceptable quality approved by the Executive and purchased from the League.

EC5 UMPIRES

EC5.1 EXPENSES:

EC5.1.1 For all ties, standard all-inclusive expenses as detailed in Rule L10.5.1.3 shall be paid by the Home Club to each umpire *(For 2026: £51)*.

EC5.2 EXTENDED TIES:

Extended Ties will be as per Rule S5.2.

EC6 TROPHIES

EC6.1 The team winning the Competition will receive the Earnshaw Cup and be entitled to hold the trophy until 1st July of the following season.

EC6.2 Both finalists shall each be presented with 13 individual trophies.

T20 TROPHY

TT1 TITLE AND CONSTITUTION

TT1.1 COMPETITION NAME:

The competition shall be called the T20 Trophy (The Competition).

TT1.2 COMPETITION RULES:

It shall be played under League Rules except as provided below:

TT1.3 QUALIFYING TEAMS & FORMAT:

TT1.3.1 The Competition shall be played between the 12 Premiership Teams.

TT1.3.2 In Year 1:

TT1.3.2.1 Teams will be randomly placed into 4 groups of 3 teams, and shall play each other once over as allocated by the Match Secretary.

TT1.3.2.2 Four of the competing clubs shall have the opportunity to host a set of three Group games, with each of the three teams in the group playing in two games.

TT1.3.3 In Years 2 & 3:

TT1.3.3.1 The teams in the four groups shall remain the same during years 2 & 3, but with promoted teams taking the place of relegated teams.

TT1.3.3.2 Hosting venues be allocated by the Match Secretary on a rotational basis.

TT2 DRAWS AND TIES

TT2.1 GROUP GAMES:

TT2.1.1 START TIMES: Group games at each of the four hosting clubs will commence at: 10.30am; 1.45pm and 5.00pm.

TT2.1.2 RESERVE DATE: Should it not be possible, due to adverse weather etc, for a group tie to be started or result to be achieved by DLS, it shall be rescheduled onto a single reserve date where any group fixtures that could not complete will be played. Should it not be possible for a fixture to be completed by the end of the reserve date then it will be deemed to be abandoned.

TT2.1.3 POINTS: 2 Points will be awarded for a win, 1 point for a tie (no account to be taken of wickets lost), 1 point for a game which is abandoned without a result being achieved and 0 points for a loss.

TT2.2 QUARTER FINALS:

TT2.2.1 The quarter-finals will be played on a single Sunday, as allocated by the Match Secretary, at different grounds, and will commence at 2.00pm.

TT2.2.2 The FOUR Group winners plus the FOUR runners-up across the four Groups (determined by points and then net run rate) will go through to the Quarter-Finals.

TT2.2.3 ALL GROUP WINNERS will have home advantage.

TT2.2.4 Quarter-Final Ties will be as follows:

Game 1: Winner Group 1 v Runner-up Group 4

Game 2: Winner Group 2 v Runner-up Group 3

Game 3: Winner Group 3 v Runner-up Group 2

Game 4: Winner Group 4 v Runner-up Group 1

TT2.2.5 RESERVE DATE: Should it not be possible, due to adverse weather for a Quarter-Final tie to be started or result to be achieved by DLS, the tie will be rescheduled for the Reserve Date. Any further rescheduling will be decided by the Executive.

TT2.3 THE SEMI-FINALS:

TT2.3.1 The four Quarter-Final winners will go through to the semi-finals.

TT2.3.2 In the Semi-Finals ties will not involve teams they have previously played in the group stages.

TT2.3.3 Semi-Final Ties will be:

Winner Game 1 v Winner Game 2

Winner Game 3 v Winner Game 4

TT2.3.4 There will be a draw to determine which team play at home.

TT2.3.5 Both semi-finals shall be played on a single Sunday, as allocated by the Match Secretary and commence at 2.00pm. They shall take place on the same date as T20 Shield Semi-Finals.

TT2.3.6 RESERVE DATE: Should it not be possible, due to adverse weather for a semi-final tie to be started or result to be achieved by DLS, the tie will be rescheduled for the Reserve Date. Any further rescheduling will be decided by the Executive.

TT2.4 THE GRAND FINAL:

TT2.4.1 The Grand Final shall take place on the same day as the T20 Shield Final. It shall be staged at the ground of one of the four competing clubs, providing ground grading allows, and as selected by ballot.

TT2.4.2 No club shall be able to host the Sykes Cup Final, and T20 Grand Final in any one season.

TT2.5 UNFULFILLED FIXTURES:

TT2.5.1 Any club failing to fulfil a fixture shall be fined £50.

TT2.5.2 In the event that the transgressors are the away side they shall be required to pay a further £100 in compensation to their opponents.

TT2.5.3 In any event the transgressors will also be required to pay both umpires, if the said umpires have attended the match.

TT3 PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

TT3.1 IN SEASON REGISTRATIONS:

Eligibility to play in the Competition shall be as per Sykes Cup Rule C3.2.2 - three prior League or Cup/Shield matches played.

TT4 MATCH PROCEDURES - GROUND MARKINGS AND EQUIPMENT

TT4.1 THE PLAYING PITCH:

The playing pitch shall be sited as near as possible to the centre of the ground, that may not necessarily be the centre of the playing square, as ground conditions will allow.

TT4.2 FIELDING ZONE:

A fielding zone shall be drawn on the field of play. This shall consist of two semi circles having as their respective centres each middle stump and joined by a parallel line on each side of the pitch.

The radius of each of the circles shall be 30 yards but where any part of this zone would impinge within 5 yards of the boundary line then it shall be drawn

at that limitation. The perimeter of the fielding zone shall be marked by a series of white discs which, to maintain uniformity, shall be purchased from the League.

TT4.3 MATCH BALLS:

Each team shall use its own new Readers County Crown pink ball, of a brand and grade approved by the Executive, and purchased from the League. Spare balls should also be pink, and although not new, should be approved by the League, and of acceptable quality.

TT4.4 COLOURED CLOTHING:

TT4.4.1 The use of coloured clothing is mandatory.

TT4.4.2 The League directive on clothing advertising shall apply, and numbers and/or names may be used on the back of shirts.

TT4.4.3 Should advertising, numbering and/or names be used all eleven players in the team shall be attired in the same clothing design.

TT4.5 SIGHT SCREENS & STUMPS:

TT4.5.1 Sight screens shall be white.

TT4.5.2 Coloured stumps and bails are optional.

TT5 MATCH PROCEDURES - PLAYING CONDITIONS AND RESULTS

TT5.1 MATCH CONDUCT:

All matches shall be conducted in accordance with the Laws of Cricket, including the Spirit of Cricket and all ECB Directives, Guidelines & Regulations, with the exception of MCC Law 42.1.4 where the batsman at the wicket may deputise for their captain, except as otherwise provided by this Rule.

TT5.2 THE TOSS:

Captains shall toss for the choice of innings ten minutes before the scheduled start of the tie, and if a team is unable to toss at this time it shall forfeit the right of that choice.

TT5.3 LENGTH OF INNINGS:

TT5.3.1 In an uninterrupted tie each team shall bat for 20 complete overs unless all out earlier or a result is reached.

TT5.3.2 There shall normally be two sessions of play of one hour and fifteen minutes each, separated by an interval of ten minutes.

TT5.4 OVER RATE PENALTY:

TT5.4.1 Should the bowling team fail to complete the scheduled 20 overs in the time allocated of one hour and fifteen minutes, of actual playing time (any time lost due to injury or other unforeseen incidents are not to be included as playing time), from the start of the next new over a minimum of five fielders (plus the bowler and the wicketkeeper) must be inside the fielding zone for the remainder of the innings.

TT5.4.2 If the innings is interrupted, as specified in Rule TT5.6 the over-rate penalty shall apply based on the re-scheduled cessation time for that innings. The time allowed shall be reduced by 7 minutes for every two overs deducted.

TT5.5 THE INTERVAL:

Between innings, and at the request of the captain of the team batting second, the host club shall be responsible for the sweeping and rolling of the pitch and the remarking of the creases.

TT5.6 DELAYED OR INTERRUPTED TIES:

TT5.6.1 DELAYED START:

TT5.6.1.1 GROUP GAMES:

TT5.6.1.1.1 For a delayed start in a GROUP GAME, 1 over per side will be deducted for every 6 minutes lost up to a **minimum of a 5 overs per side match.**

TT5.6.1.1.2 In circumstances where, before the commencement of play, the prospect of inclement weather and/or bad light is a consideration umpires may reduce the number of overs as above.

TT5.6.1.2 QUARTER FINAL & SEMI-FINAL:

TT5.6.1.2.1 In a Quarter-Final or Semi-Final tie there shall be 90 MINUTES WAIVER TIME, which unlike League games, shall be used from the scheduled start of the game. Should all waiver time be used prior to the start of play, overs shall be deducted as in TT5.6.1.1.1.

TT5.6.2 INTERRUPTED GAMES:

TT5.6.2.1 Time Lost in the game

TT5.6.2.1.1 For all interruptions due to ground and/or weather conditions the umpires should note the time lost during any suspension period.

TT5.6.2.1.2 In a GROUP GAME, interrupted by ground and/or weather conditions the Duckworth Lewis Stern method shall be implemented. THERE SHALL BE NO WAIVER TIME. The amount of time lost in each suspension period to be known as "relevant time lost", shall determine a revision to the number of overs remaining in the game.

TT5.6.2.1.3 In a QUARTER-FINAL or SEMI-FINAL tie interrupted (or delayed as in TT5.6.1.2.1), by ground and/or weather conditions for MORE THAN 90 MINUTES accumulated time (THE WAIVER TIME) the Duckworth Lewis Stern method shall be implemented. The amount of time lost in each suspension period to be known as "relevant time lost", shall determine a revision to the number of overs remaining in the game.

TT5.6.2.1.4 In the FINAL, Rule TT5.6.2.1.3 should apply, if time allows, together with any special on-day regulations determined by the Executive.

TT5.6.2.1.5 The umpires shall inform the DLSMM of the number of overs lost during any suspension period before any recommencement of play. The DLSMM will record a new Suspension Period in the PCS App and, if the 1st innings is complete calculate the Revised First Innings Total (RFIT).

TT5.6.2.2 Interruptions in 1st Innings:

For every full 6 minutes of any relevant time lost, 1 over shall be deducted from both innings up until the scheduled completion of the first innings. After this, overs will be deducted as in Rule TT5.6.2.3 below.

TT5.6.2.3 Interruptions in 2nd Innings:

For every full 6 minutes of any relevant time lost 2 overs shall be deducted from the 2nd innings.

TT5.6.2.4 Mid Over interruptions in play:

In a game interrupted in mid over by ground and/or weather conditions and resumption is within the same innings then the over in progress shall continue unless that part over is the only one remaining in the innings. In the latter case that innings shall be closed and if that were the 1st innings the length of the 2nd innings would be equal to the number of full overs played in the 1st innings.

TT5.6.2.5 Any revised 1st innings total should be posted on the scoreboard, and checked by the umpires before play commences.

TT5.7 RESTRICTIONS ON THE PLACEMENT OF FIELDERS:

TT5.7.1 A fielding zone shall be drawn on the field of play as per Rule TT4.2.

TT5.7.2 "POWER PLAY OVERS":

TT5.7.2.1 For the first 6 overs of each innings only 2 fielders shall be permitted outside the zone at the instant of delivery. In the event of any infringement, the umpire at square leg shall call and signal "no ball".

TT5.7.2.2 In circumstances where the number of overs is reduced for either team, the fielding restrictions shall be as follows:

Total overs in innings	20-19	18-15	14-12	11-9	8-5
Fielding restriction overs	6	5	4	3	2

If on any resumption of play the number of overs for the restrictions has been exceeded, then the above should take effect immediately.

TT5.7.3 For each over following the sixth over, except as in Rule TT5.7.2.2 above, a minimum of 4 fielders (plus the bowler and the wicketkeeper) must be inside the fielding zone at the instant of delivery. In the event of any infringement the umpire at square leg shall call and signal "no ball".

TT5.7.4 At any time during the innings there shall be no more than 5 fielders on the leg side at the instant of delivery. In the event of any infringement the umpire at square leg shall call and signal "no ball".

TT5.8 "TIMED OUT":

The Law of Cricket 40, timed out, shall apply except that the incoming batsman must be in a position to take guard, or for his partner to receive the next ball, within 90 seconds of the fall of the previous wicket. This amendment shall be strictly applied.

TT5.9 "LEG SIDE WIDE":

All deliveries passing wide of the leg stump, and outside the line of the batsman's body, that do not come into contact with the bat or any part of the batsman's person, shall be called WIDE.

TT5.10 NO BALL:

- TT5.10.1 The Laws of Cricket 21.15, shall apply except that the **penalty for a no ball shall be two runs.**
- TT5.10.2 The delivery following a no ball (The Laws of Cricket 21) shall be a free hit, for whichever batsman is facing.
- TT5.10.3 If the delivery for a free hit is not legitimate (no ball or wide) then the next hit also becomes a free hit, for whichever batsman is facing.
- TT5.10.4 The fielding team is not allowed to change the field for a free hit, if the same batsman (who received the original no ball) is on strike.
- TT5.10.5 For any free hit the striker may only be dismissed under the circumstances that apply for a no ball, even if the free hit delivery is a wide ball. All such penalties are in addition to any runs that may be scored otherwise.

TT5.11 BOWLER'S RUN UP:

Bowlers run ups are not restricted. However, players should be mindful of the over rate penalty that will be applied once an innings extends beyond one hour and fifteen minutes.

TT5.12 NUMBER OF OVERS PER BOWLER:

TT5.12.1 No bowler may bowl more than four overs.

TT5.12.2 DELAYED START OR INTERRUPTED MATCH:

TT5.12.2.1 Where the overs are reduced for both sides or for the side bowling second, no bowler may bowl more than one-fifth of the total overs allowed (unless such a number has been exceeded before the interruption), except that where the total overs are not divisible by five, an additional over shall be allowed to the minimum number of bowlers necessary to make up the balance.

Example 1: Overs are reduced to 13 per side. Three bowlers may bowl a maximum of 3 overs.

Example 2: After 8 overs, rain interrupts play and the innings is reduced to 12 overs. Both opening bowlers have bowled 4 overs. Two bowlers can bowl 3 overs and three bowlers can bowl 2 overs. Bowlers 1 and 2 have already exceeded this limit. They count as the two bowlers who were allowed the extra over (3 as opposed to 2) and so any other bowlers are limited to 2 overs.

TT5.12.2.2 When an interruption occurs mid-over and on resumption the bowler has exceeded the new maximum allocation, he will be allowed to finish the uncompleted over.

TT5.12.2.3 In the event of a bowler breaking down and being unable to complete an over, the remaining balls will be bowled by another bowler. Such part of an over will count as a full over only in so far as each bowler's limit is concerned.

TT5.13 THE RESULT:

TT5.13.1 The team making the higher score in each tie, taking into account any use of the Duckworth Lewis Stern Method, shall be the winners.

TT5.13.2 INTERRUPTIONS IN PLAY;

TT5.13.2.1 **If a minimum of 5 overs** has been completed in the 2nd innings, and there is no further play, the DLSMM shall record a new suspension break in the PCS App stating “zero overs remaining”. This will give a new RFIT which will determine the result.

TT5.13.2.2 The game is automatically abandoned when the total number of overs available for the 2nd Innings drops **below 5 overs** (provided a result has not previously been reached).

TT5.13.3 Should the scores be level in the Quarter-Finals; Semi-Finals or Final, the winners shall be determined by reference to the following criteria in order of priority:

1. The team losing fewer wickets per over.
2. The team with the higher number of sixes per over.
3. The team with the lesser number of extras per over.

TT6 UMPIRES

TT6.1 For all ties, 50% of standard all-inclusive expenses as detailed in Rule L10.5.1.1 (Calculated to the nearest £1.00 above), shall be paid to each umpire (**For 2026: £34**).

TT6.2 In any extended tie additional travelling expenses shall be paid for each further day that the umpires are in attendance.

TT6.3 For ties up to and including the Semi-Final the hosting club will be liable for the payment of the umpires.

TT6.4 The Executive shall be responsible for all costs in the Final, and for the provision and presentation of suitable mementoes to the appointed umpires.

TT7 TROPHIES

TT7.1 The team winning the Competition shall receive the T20 Trophy and are entitled to hold it until the 1st July of the following season.

TT7.2 Both finalists shall each be presented with 13 individual trophies.

TT7.3 A special award shall be presented to the individual who is adjudged to have been the Player of the Final.

T20 SHIELD

TS1 TITLE AND CONSTITUTION

TS1.1 COMPETITION NAME:

The competition shall be called the T20 Shield (The Competition).

TS1.2 COMPETITION RULES:

It shall be played under League Rules except as provided below:

TS1.3 QUALIFYING TEAMS & FORMAT:

The competition shall be played on a pre drawn knockout basis between non-Premiership 1st teams.

TS1.4 BYES:

Byes into Round 2 are to be given to the highest qualifying finishing teams from the previous league season, to ensure a group of 16 teams in Round 2.

TS2 DRAWS AND TIES

TS2.1 START DATE & TIME:

TS2.1.1 All games shall start at 6.30pm with the exception of the Semi-Final and Final.

TS2.1.2 Round 1; Round 2 and Quarter-Finals shall be played on a Thursday evening in the week allocated by the Match Secretary.

TS2.2 TIES:

TS2.2.1 Should no play be possible or result achieved under Rule TS5.6 (delayed start/interrupted game) on the allocated Thursday, the game shall be rescheduled onto the reserve date which will be one week later.

TS2.2.2 RESERVE DATE: If a result is not achieved on the Reserve Date, the tie will be rescheduled for the following Tuesday.

TS2.2.3 Should a result not be achieved on that following Tuesday, the result shall be decided by a bowl out as per Rule C4.9 or if not possible, the toss of a coin shall decide the result.

TS2.3 SEMI-FINALS:

TS2.3.1 Both semi-finals shall be played on a single Sunday, as allocated by the Match Secretary, and commence at 2.00pm. They will take place on the same date as the T20 Trophy semi-finals.

TS2.3.2 RESERVE DATE: Should no play be possible or result achieved under Rule TS5.6, the tie will be rescheduled for the Reserve Date. Any further rescheduling will be decided by the Executive.

TS2.4 THE GRAND FINAL:

TS2.4.1 The T20 Shield Final shall be played on the same day as the T20 Trophy Final and will be staged at the ground of one of the four competing clubs, provided ground grading allows, and as selected by ballot.

TS2.4.2 No club shall be able to host the Sykes Cup Final, and T20 Grand Final in any one season.

TS2.5 UNFULFILLED FIXTURES

TS2.5.1 Any club failing to fulfil a fixture shall be fined £50.

TS2.5.2 In the event that the transgressors are the away side, they shall be required to pay a further £100 in compensation to their opponents.

TS2.5.3 In any event the transgressors will also be required to pay both umpires, if the said umpires have attended the match.

TS3 PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

TS3.1 IN SEASON REGISTRATIONS:

TS5.1 MATCH CONDUCT:

TS5.2 THE TOSS:

TS5.4 OVER RATE PENALTY:

TS5.4.1 Should the bowling team fail to complete the scheduled 20 overs in the time allocated of one hour and fifteen minutes, of actual playing time (any time lost due to injury or other unforeseen incidents are not to be included as playing time), from the start of the next new over a minimum of five fielders (plus the bowler and the wicketkeeper) must be inside the fielding zone for the remainder of the innings.

TS5.4.2 If the innings is interrupted, as specified in Rule TS5.6 the over-rate penalty will apply based on the re-scheduled cessation time for that innings. The time allowed shall be reduced by 7 minutes for every two overs deducted.

TS5.5 THE INTERVAL:

Between innings, and at the request of the captain of the team batting second, the host club shall be responsible for the sweeping and rolling of the pitch and the remarking of the creases.

TS5.6 DELAYED OR INTERRUPTED TIES:

TS5.6.1 DELAYED START:

TS5.6.1.1 ROUNDS 1, 2 & QUARTER-FINALS:

TS5.6.1.1.1 For a delayed start in ROUNDS 1, 2 and QUARTER-FINAL GAMES, 1 over per side will be deducted for every 6 minutes lost up to a **minimum of a 5 overs per side match**.

TS5.6.1.1.2 In circumstances where, before the commencement of play, the prospect of inclement weather and/or bad light is a consideration umpires may reduce the number of overs as above.

TS5.6.1.2 SEMI-FINAL:

TS5.6.1.2.1 In a Semi-Final tie there shall be 90 MINUTES WAIVER TIME, which unlike League games, shall be used from the scheduled start of the game. Should all waiver time be used prior to the start of play, overs shall be deducted as in TS5.6.1.1.1.

TS5.6.2 INTERRUPTED GAMES:

TS5.6.2.1 Time Lost in the game

TS5.6.2.1.1 For all interruptions due to ground and/or weather conditions the umpires should note the time lost during any suspension period.

TS5.6.2.1.2 In a game in ROUNDS 1 & 2 and the QUARTER-FINAL, interrupted by ground and/or weather conditions the Duckworth Lewis Stern method shall be implemented. THERE SHALL BE NO WAIVER TIME. The amount of time lost in each suspension period to be known as "relevant time lost", shall determine a revision to the number of overs remaining in the game.

TS5.6.2.1.3 In a SEMI-FINAL tie interrupted (or delayed as in TS5.6.1.2.1), by ground and/or weather conditions for MORE THAN 90 MINUTES accumulated time (THE

WAIVER TIME) the Duckworth Lewis Stern method shall be implemented. The amount of time lost in each suspension period to be known as "relevant time lost", shall determine a revision to the number of overs remaining in the game.

TS5.6.2.1.4 In the FINAL, Rule TT5.6.2.1.3 should apply, if time allows, together with any special on-day regulations determined by the Executive.

TS5.6.2.1.5 The umpires shall inform the DLSMM of the number of overs lost during any suspension period before any recommencement of play. The DLSMM will record a new Suspension Period in the PCS App and, if the 1st innings is complete calculate the Revised First Innings Total (RFIT).

TS5.6.2.2 Interruptions in 1st Innings:

For every full 6 minutes of any relevant time lost, 1 over shall be deducted from both innings up until the scheduled completion of the first innings. After this, overs will be deducted as in Rule TT5.6.2.3.

TS5.6.2.3 Interruptions in 2nd Innings:

For every full 6 minutes of any relevant time lost 2 overs shall be deducted from the 2nd innings.

TS5.6.2.4 Mid Over interruptions in play:

In a game interrupted in mid over by ground and/or weather conditions and resumption is within the same innings then the over in progress shall continue unless that part over is the only one remaining in the innings. In the latter case that innings shall be closed and if that were the 1st innings the length of the 2nd innings would be equal to the number of full overs played in the 1st innings.

TS5.6.2.5 Any revised 1st innings total should be posted on the scoreboard, and checked by the umpires before play commences.

TS5.7 RESTRICTIONS ON THE PLACEMENT OF FIELDERS:

TS5.7.1 A fielding zone shall be drawn on the field of play as per RuleTS4.2.

TS5.7.2 "POWER PLAY OVERS":

TS5.7.2.1 For the first 6 overs of each innings only 2 fielders shall be permitted outside the zone at the instant of delivery. In the event of any infringement, the umpire at square leg shall call and signal "no ball"

TS5.7.2.2 In circumstances where the number of overs is reduced for either team, the fielding restrictions shall be as follows:

Total overs in innings	20-19	18-15	14-12	11-9	8-5
Fielding restriction overs	6	5	4	3	2

If on any resumption of play the number of overs for the restrictions has been exceeded, then the above should take effect immediately.

TS5.7.3 For each over following the sixth over, except as in Rule TS5.7.2.2 above, a minimum of 4 fielders (plus the bowler and the wicketkeeper) must be inside the fielding zone at the instant of delivery. In the event of any infringement the umpire at square leg shall call and signal "no ball".

TS5.7.4 At any time during the innings there shall be no more than 5 fielders on the leg side at the instant of delivery. In the event of any infringement the umpire at square leg shall call and signal "no ball".

TS5.8 "TIMED OUT":

The Law of Cricket 40, timed out, shall apply except that the incoming batsman must be in a position to take guard, or for his partner to receive the next ball, within 90 seconds of the fall of the previous wicket. This amendment shall be strictly applied.

TS5.9 "LEG SIDE WIDE":

All deliveries passing wide of the leg stump, and outside the line of the batsman's body, that do not come into contact with the bat or any part of the batsman's person, shall be called WIDE.

TS5.10 NO BALL:

TS5.10.1 The Laws of Cricket 21.15, shall apply except that the **penalty for a no ball shall be two runs.**

TS5.10.2 The delivery following a no ball (The Laws of Cricket 21) shall be a free hit, for whichever batsman is facing.

TS5.10.3 If the delivery for a free hit is not legitimate (no ball or wide) then the next hit also becomes a free hit, for whichever batsman is facing.

TS5.10.4 The fielding team is not allowed to change the field for a free hit, if the same batsman (who received the original no ball) is on strike.

TS5.10.5 For any free hit the striker may only be dismissed under the circumstances that apply for a no ball, even if the free hit delivery is a wide ball. All such penalties are in addition to any runs that may be scored otherwise.

TS5.11 BOWLER'S RUN UP:

Bowlers run ups are not restricted. However, players should be mindful of the over rate penalty that will be applied once an innings extends beyond one hour and fifteen minutes.

TS5.12 NUMBER OF OVERS PER BOWLER:

TS5.12.1 No bowler may bowl more than four overs.

TS5.12.2 DELAYED START OR INTERRUPTED MATCH:

TS5.12.2.1 Where the overs are reduced for both sides or for the side bowling second, no bowler may bowl more than one-fifth of the total overs allowed (unless such a number has been exceeded before the interruption), except that where the total overs are not divisible by five, an additional over shall be allowed to the minimum number of bowlers necessary to make up the balance.

Example 1: Overs are reduced to 13 per side. Three bowlers may bowl a maximum of 3 overs.

Example 2: After 8 overs, rain interrupts play and the innings is reduced to 12 overs. Both opening bowlers have bowled 4 overs. Two bowlers can bowl 3 overs and three bowlers can bowl 2 overs. Bowlers 1 and 2 have already exceeded this limit. They count as the two bowlers who were allowed the extra over (3 as opposed to 2) and so any other bowlers are limited to 2 overs.

- TS5.12.2.2 When an interruption occurs mid-over and on resumption the bowler has exceeded the new maximum allocation, he will be allowed to finish the uncompleted over.
- TS5.12.2.3 In the event of a bowler breaking down and being unable to complete an over, the remaining balls will be bowled by another bowler. Such part of an over will count as a full over only in so far as each bowler's limit is concerned.

TS5.13 THE RESULT:

TS5.13.1 The team making the higher score in each tie taking into account any use of the Duckworth Lewis Stern Method, shall be the winners.

TS5.13.2 INTERRUPTIONS IN PLAY;

TS5.13.2.1 **If a minimum of 5 overs** has been completed in the 2nd innings, and there is no further play, the DLMM shall record a new suspension break in the PCS App stating "zero overs remaining". This will give a new RFIT which will determine the result.

TS5.13.2.2 The game is automatically abandoned when the total number of overs available for the 2nd Innings drops **below 5 overs** (provided a result has not previously been reached).

TS5.13.3 Should the scores be level in all ties, the winners shall be determined by reference to the following criteria in order of priority:

1. The team losing fewer wickets per over.
2. The team with the higher number of sixes per over.
3. The team with the lesser number of extras per over.

TS6 UMPIRES

TS6.1 For all ties, 50% of standard all-inclusive expenses as detailed in Rule L10.5.1.1 (Calculated to the nearest £1.00 above) shall be paid to each umpire
(For 2026: £31).

TS6.2 In any extended tie additional travelling expenses shall be paid for each further day that the umpires are in attendance.

TS6.3 For ties up to and including the semi-final the *hosting* club will be liable for the payment of the umpires.

TS6.4 The Executive shall be responsible for all costs in the Final, and for the provision and presentation of suitable mementoes to the appointed umpires.

TS7 TROPHIES

TS7.1 The team winning the Competition shall receive the T20 Shield and are entitled to hold it until the 1st July of the following season.

TS7.2 Both finalists shall each be presented with 13 individual trophies.

TS7.3 A special award shall be presented to the individual who is adjudged to have been the player of the Final.

SUNDAY SECTION

SS1 CONSTITUTION

The Sunday Section shall be an integral part of the Huddersfield Premier Cricket League with its main aims being to introduce young players to senior cricket; provide playing opportunities for those not available for Saturday League cricket, and to increase participation levels of those who may have low involvement during League cricket games.

SS2 RULES

The rules of Alliance Division 2,3 &4 shall apply except where shown below:

SS3 MEMBERSHIP & SUBSCRIPTION

SS3.1 MANAGEMENT:

The Sunday Section shall be managed by a Competition Secretary (Phil Senior for season 2026).

SS3.2 PARTICIPATION:

Clubs wishing to participate in the Sunday Section shall apply to the Competition Secretary each season by the scheduled date of the League AGM.

SS3.3 MEMBERSHIP FEE:

An annual subscription of **£26**, adjusted each odd year in line with RPI and League rules, shall be payable to cover administration expenses.

SS4 PLAYERS

SS4.1 PLAYER REGISTRATION:

The competition shall be strictly for amateur players who have been registered in accordance with Huddersfield Premier Cricket League rules, including Rule L9.2 (players registered on the day of the match). However, players may be loaned from other clubs provided they satisfy Rules SS4.2.1 and SS4.2.2.

SS4.2 PLAYER ELIGIBILITY:

SS4.2.1 No player who has played, or was deemed to have played in the club's previous 1st team game shall be allowed to play in the following Sunday Section game with the exception of a player under 17 years of age.

SS4.2.2 With the exception of players under 19 years of age, no more than 5 players who played or were deemed to have played in the club's previous 2nd team game, shall be allowed to play in the following Sunday Section game.

SS5 FIXTURES & POINTS

SS5.1 FIXTURES & START TIME:

SS5.1.1 FIXTURES:

All matches shall be played on dates arranged by the Competition Secretary.

SS5.1.2 START TIME:

The scheduled start time for all Sunday Section games shall be 1.00pm.

SS5.2 REARRANGED MATCHES:

SS5.2.1 With the agreement of both participating clubs, fixtures may be:

- moved to the opponent's ground,
- played at an alternative venue, or
- arranged to be played on an alternative date.

SS5.2.2 The latest date for any rearrangement shall be the Sunday after the last League fixture of the current HPCL season.

SS5.2.3 The Home Club must inform the Competition Secretary of the details of any rearranged matches.

SS5.3 MATCH POINTS:

Points will be awarded as per existing HPCL rules.

SS6 MATCH PROCEDURES

SS6.1 NOMINATION OF PLAYERS:

SS6.1.1 Clubs will NOT be expected to complete the TMRF, but must ensure that team names are correctly recorded in Play-Cricket before the game.

SS6.1.2 Clubs will be expected to provide umpires with the names and ages of any players 19 years of age and under, in order to help enforce any ECB fast bowling & fielding directives.

SS6.2 MATCH BALLS:

Each team shall use its own match ball, not necessarily new but of acceptable quality and one which has been approved by the League.

SS6.3 TEA INTERVAL:

SS6.3.1 Home clubs shall have the option as to whether they provide teas.

SS6.3.2 There shall be a tea interval of 30 minutes between innings. However, if mutually agreed by captains and umpires at the toss, this may be reduced to a minimum of 20 minutes at games where teas are not provided.

SS6.4 LENGTH OF INNINGS:

Each team shall bowl a maximum of 40 overs.

SS6.5 NUMBER OF OVERS PER BOWLER:

No bowler may bowl more than one fifth of the allotted overs. Rule L8.11.3.

SS6.6 EARLY ABANDONMENT:

Games may be abandoned before the start of play (Rule L8.15) with the agreement of both Club Captains/Representatives.

SS6.7 DELAYED START:

In the event of a delayed start reductions in overs shall be in accordance with Rule L8.10.3 (1 over per side deducted for each 6 minutes lost).

SS6.8 REDUCED OVERS GAME:

If both captains agree they may prior to the start of play agree to reduce the number of overs per side down to a minimum of 20 overs.

SS6.9 INTERRUPTED MATCHES:

The Duckworth Lewis Stern method shall be used to determine a result in an interrupted game.

SS7 RESULTS

Results must be submitted in accordance with Rule L8.20.5 and Play Cricket guidelines.

SS8 UMPIRES

Each team shall provide its own Club Umpire and be responsible for any expenses paid to them.

SS9 RULE CHANGES

Changes to rules are to be made annually between participating clubs. Rule changes should be lodged with the Competition Secretary by 30th September, and will need a majority vote from participating clubs to become adopted.
